THE ADDRESS IN REPLY TO SPEECH

From the Throne in Russian National Assembly--Historic, Courteous and Diplomatic--It Has the Grip of an Iron Hand in a Silken Glove.

St. PETERSBURG, May 16--The following is the text of the address in reply to the speech from the throne:

"It has pleased your majesty in your speech addressed to the people's representatives to express your determination to unshakably preserve the institutions whereby the people have been called on to exercise legislative power in conjunction with the regular monarch. The parliament regards the monarch's formal promise to the people as a sure pledge of that consolidation and of the further development of order and legislation in accordance with a strictly constitutional basis. The house will for its part make every effort to perfect the principle of popular representation and to submit for your majesty's assent a bill relating to such representation basing it in accordance with the unanimously expressed will of the people on universal suffrage.

"Your majesty's appeal for common work for the good of the fatherland finds a lively echo in the hearts of the members of parliament in the constitution of which representatives of all classes and nationalities are united in an ardent desire to regenerate Russia and create a state of order on the basis of all living in peace with one another. Parliament wishes to point out that fruitful work under present conditions is impossible, as officials are trying to separate the emperor from his people. Only when the ministers are made representative to the people can the idea of the absolute irresponsibility of the monarch take root in the hearts of his subjects. Only a ministry enjoying the confidence of parliament can strengthen confidence in the government and the existence of such confidence can make tranquil and regular labors of parliament possible.

"Above all it is first necessary in Russia to repeal the exceptional laws, the laws of increased protection and the state of siege under cover of which the arbitrariness and irresponsibility of officials appear and develop. At the same time the principle of the responsibility of the administration to the representatives of the nation must be adopted. Further, for fruitful labor on the part of the parliament, there must be introduced the principle of true popular representation, which consists in the recognition that the union of the monarch and the people is the only source of legislative power."

"Every barrier between the emperor and his people must be removed. Further, there must be no domain of legislation which would always be closed; revision by representatives of the people in conjunction with the monarch. Parliament holds that it is its duty to declare to your majesty in the name of the people that the whole nation will carry out the creative work of renewing its life with all its power and energy, with a firm belief in the luminous elevation of the fatherland if it between it and the throne there does not stand an imperial council composed of appointed dignitaries and persons elected by the highest classes of the population and if the legislative powers of the people's representatives are not limited by special laws.

"In the domain of the legislative work before it, parliament regards as an absolute necessity for the country a precise law assuring inviolability of the persons, liberty of conscience, speech and the press, association gathering and strikes. Without these fundamental principles, which were laid down by the imperial manifesto of October 30, no reform of the social condition is imaginable.

"Parliament is actuated by the unshakable conviction that neither liberty nor order can be assured without the equality of all citizens being established before the law. Therefore, parliament is preparing a bill establishing the equality of all citizens and simultaneously by removing all class of national, religious privileges an effort will be made to free the country from administrative tutelage.

"While leaving the limitation of civil rights to the law courts, parliament considers that the death sentence is not admissible as a basis for judicial sentence. Parliament feels justified in declaring that it will be the interpreter of the unanimous views of the whole nation on the day of the restoration of the law abolishing the death penalty.

"Careful examination of the needs of the peasantry and the measures called for by them will form parliament's next task. The rural population is impatiently awaiting the satisfaction of agrarian needs. Parliament would not be doing its duty if it did not make a law for the satisfaction of these needs by the aid of the crown domains, monastic lands and the compulsory expropriation of land belonging to the owners of estates. Parliament also holds that it is necessary to pass a law confirming the peasants in their enjoyment of equal rights and freeing them from oppression by arbitrary authority and from tutelage. Parliament holds that satisfaction of the needs of the working classes is equally incapable of being deferred. The first steps in this direction must be recognition of freedom of organization for workmen and their right to take independent action for the elevation of their material and moral welfare. Popular education is another task that lies before parliament. Parliament further holds that it is necessary to include among the tasks the fulfillment of which cannot be deferred, the question of the satisfaction of the long matured demands of the various nationalities of the empire. Russia affords the example of a state people by many races and nationalities. Union in spirit of all of these is only possible through the satisfaction of the needs of each, whereby the individually of the diverse sides of their lives will be preserved and developed. Parliament will give careful heed to the task of giving wide satisfaction to these just demands."
