ing the Government ranks he said, "If there be in our ranks a man known so rich and powerful as to be predatory, that man can render the Liberal party no greater service than by leaving it." On the tariff question he insisted that Tariff for revenue was "Liberal principle and they ought to stand by it." He was no doubt fired to the extreme of his eloquence by recurring events and by the chaos into which the party had fallen as the natural outcome of the mixture of policies dished out at different stages by their unstable leader, and particularly his coquetting with the Western Free Trade policy which in its very essence is nauseating to the people of Quebec. At this meeting Messrs Lemieux, Riviere, McMaster, Smith, Mitchell, Archambault, and many other leading Liberals were present.

Now that the crops are fairly housed and the farmers a little more at leisure, with a liberal supply of tax notices to offset the lower prices of their products, they are again taking up the government incubus which by an unhappy misfortune was placed upon their shoulders, and indignation meetings give promise of becoming once more the order of the day. The first of the season was held a few days ago at Lower Freetown, one of the most intelligent centres of Premier Bell's and the Hon. W. M. Lea's constituency. Their denunciation of the tax acts was most pronounced, and the repeal called for. The other school districts were requested to co-operate by calling meetings and joining in the chorus of protest. It would be interesting if in these discussions the people

were supplied with information as to how far favouritism prevailed in the levying of these taxes. In Charlottetown and incorporated cities or towns the assessment books can be seen by any one. The system is straight and above board. In the provincial arena it is a sealed book. We know from information on the street that a railway employee with a salary of \$650 is assessed for \$1200 on income but we do not know how much those high up in government, drawing big salaries, and with handsome private incomes in addition, are taxed, nor do we know how their near-

est and dearest political friends are tapped by the tax collector. Our farmer friends at these meetings should make enquiry.

THE MARKET

The market was a very slim one today. There was scarcely any produce in. Pork remained at 15-1-2 cents, and no change was noticeable in any of the other lines. Eggs were retailing in the building at the extortionate price of 80 cents. Butter was from 60 to 62 cents, retail, with chickens from 85 cents to \$1.25 and ducks \$1.50 each.
