He next referred to the roads. He recalled travelling on a certain piece of road between Summerside and Alberton at the rate of three miles an hour. This road has been levelled, graded, fixed up and he recalled with pleasure a joy-ride at the rate of 25 to 30 miles on this same road last summer. Similar conditions might be cited, he said, over the whole province. The benefit of these roads to the farmers was eloquently expatiated upon. The present roads with their smooth and rutless surfaces were contrasted with conditions which prevailed sixty years ago or even less, with their wear and tear upon the harness, the horses, the carriages and even the tempers of the farmers many of whom endangered their eternal salvation in denouncing and swearing at the roads. 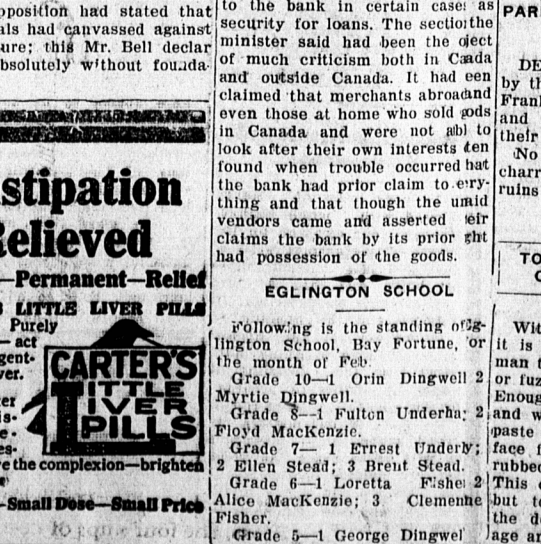
