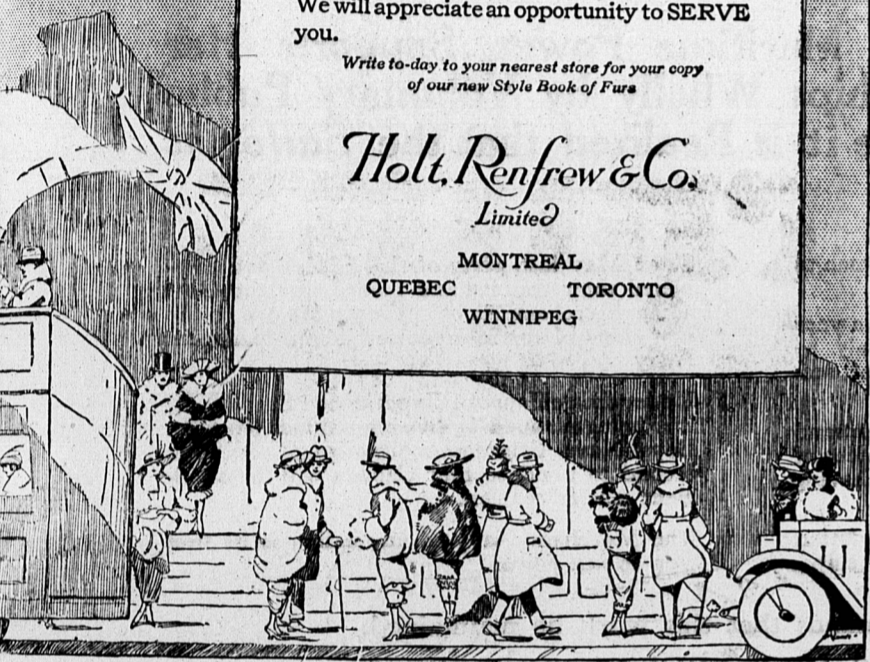

Mr. Varley On Labor Organization

At a mass meeting of workers held Thursday evening in St. Dunstan's Parish Hall in the interest of Labor organization here, Mr. William Varley, general organizer of the American Federation of Labor, dealt in his address with the functions of the different branches of the movement throughout Canada and the United States. He pointed out that the economic power of the international movement is vested in international organizations, the American Federation of Labor being an affiliation of international organizations and being also the legislative expression of the International movement in the United States. While economically we are one, legislatively—in this movement on the American continent—we are two. We have our own Legislative expression in the Trades and Labor Congress of Canada, which, so far as that function is concerned, has absolutely free autonomy.

Mr. Varley went on to deal with the question of Direct Action. There is a disruptive element throughout the continent—he said—composed of men who are desirous of using Direct Action for the purpose of achieving political objectives. To this the International movement is absolutely opposed believing, as it does, that it is not only an illegitimate method, but one bound to meet with failure, as demonstrated in the Winnipeg strike of 1919. The speaker took as an example the threat of the miners in Great Britain to strike in order to force the nationalization of the mines which was a political objective. Now, assuming that the miners should call a strike with this object in view, it would amount to declaration of civil war. And if the miners were joined by the other two members of the triple alliance it would only mean a greater civil war, with its consequent chaos and disruption of industry. And when we realize that Great Britain only produces one fifth of her necessary food stuffs it is easy to imagine the tremendous amount of suffering that would be caused amongst the workers in Great Britain. Those countries which have a surplus of food-stuffs to export do not export to a country that is in a state of financial and industrial chaos.

Mr. Varley spoke about the legislation passed in the province of Ontario and gave some striking examples showing the practical value of the Workmen's Compensation Act. An injured worker received 66-2-3 per cent of his earnings for the previous twelve months. A woman who is a widow as the result of an industrial accident \$10 per month and \$10 for each child—boys under fourteen and girls under sixteen years. A further beneficial measure which has been enacted in the Ontario in the last session of the House is the Mother's Pension Bill. Under the provisions of this Act the Commissioners appointed have the power to allow the same measure of support to widows and children as are afforded under the Compensation Act. These Commissioners began their sittings on the 1st of October and during the first few days held on thousand applications from widowed mothers in the province of Ontario. Owing to the impossibility of investigating all the circumstances thoroughly and at once a flat rate of \$40 to \$55 was given out to make temporary provision until each case could be looked into. This provision is merely temporary and will be adjusted after thorough investigation. The provisions of the Mothers' Pension Act are applicable to all widows, no matter through what cause the bread-winner has been lost or incapacitated.

Another Ontario Act which is very beneficial to workers is the Minimum Wage Act, under the provisions of which the Minimum Wage Board appointed during the last session of the House have the power to investigate the conditions under which girl and women workers are employed, and the wages paid them. They also have power by statute to increase the wages of any body of female workers to a minimum of \$15 per week. This Act is also a legal enactment in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, British Columbia and Alberta.

The objective of Labor organization here in Charlottetown is to form, sooner or later, a Trades and Labor Council which will be the legislative expression of organized labor on E. Island and will from time to time make requests of the Provincial Government for the passing of legislation in the interests of workers of this Province. In view of the fact that employers and employees at the joint industrial conference held at Ottawa, September 1919, went on record as favoring the unification of Provincial Labor laws, it will only be a



matter of time before these laws will be valid from coast to coast. Therefore the laboring men of this Province may reasonably expect to have some of their demands, when presented, placed upon the statutes.

Summer Neil, who has for some time been in the employ of Contractor W. K. Burgess, Truro, was found dead near the track in the railway yard here. Shortly after Neil's death, his wife was found in the vicinity of a park very ill, and apparently in a delirious state. She was taken to the hospital, suffering from carbolic acid poisoning. Her condition is critical. It is stated that the husband had been drinking for several days and that he and his wife had quarrelled.

Great Britain To Protect Belgium

BRUSSELS, Oct. 16.—During a recent conference in London between Lloyd George, the British Prime Minister and M. De Lacroix, Belgian Premier, concerning the question of German reparations the Franco-Belgian Military convention also was discussed according to Etiele Belgian. The newspaper quotes Premier Lloyd George as having said, if Belgium's territory is again invaded, Great Britain, as in 1914, would consider such a violation of the Causus Bill.

Selling Sugar At 10c Per Pound

NEW YORK, Oct. 15.—The declaration by dealers that rock bottom prices on sugar have been reached here was proved to be premature, when a new organized chain of grocery company's offered sugar to the public at ten cents a pound. This is believed to have been merely a move to attract custom to the new concern and other er dealers claim "sugar is being sold under cost, but it is generally taken as an indication that the tendency of market is still downwards.

The annual loss to the people of the United States through the purchase of fraudulent securities was estimated at \$500,000,000 by Charles J. Andre, secretary of the National Association of Security Commissioners, in testimony before the special state "blue sky" law commission. Mr. Andre said that about 10 per cent of the stock offered to the public in the United States was worthless, and although 38 states have "blue sky" laws, "some are so loose that practically everything gets through." The "Blue Sky" law gives the states control over the issuance of securities and power to investigate company financing.

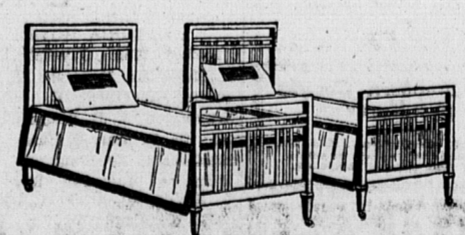
