"They Flew Alone" Brings Feats and Romance Of Fliers

A romance between two famous fliers, and its dramatic outcome, makes up the basis of "They Flew Alone," the new Anna Neagle-Robert Newton starring vehicle based on the lives of the late Amy Johnson and her husband, Jim Mollison.

Filmed in England, and with many of its scenes made at Croydon and other places where the daring Amy scored her aerial triumphs, the picture is said to be one of the most dramatic offerings of the year, as well as one of the most unusual.

Beginning with Amy's school-days and her amazing solo flight to Australia in a borrowed second-hand Moth plane, the flight that catapulted her into world-wide fame, the film stresses the subsequent high-lights of her career in vivid fashion.

Amy's record-breaking trip to Japan, South Africa and America, her friendly rivalry with Mollison in the air and her marriage to him, the break-up of that marriage six years later from causes beyond her control, and her gallant attempts to win back to her earlier fame when the war called her into service, all make for gripping drama as they are presented in the RKO Radio picture, produced and directed by Herbert Wilcox.
