STATE SURPLUS

The State's financial returns for the year just ended disclose a surplus of \$36,000. The factors which contributed to the conversion of an estimated deficit of \$518,000 into the first surplus of nine years were an increase of \$448,000 in revenue, a reduction of \$108,000 in expenditure and a grant from the Commonwealth.
