THE INTERCOLONIAL AND DEVELOPMENT.

The advocates of the sale of the Intercolonial to a company sometimes freight is carried to St John and put forward the claim that the railway under Government management has not done all that it should have done in developing manufacturing industries and hotels, &c along its route. To this the Moncton Transcript very truly replies that the company railways have done even less in promoting new industries in the portions of the Maritime Provinces which they serve.

There are five or six hundred miles of company-owned railways in New Brunswick, a longer mileage by far than the Intercolonial lines in that Province. And it may be asked what notable industry they have created or greatly developed? What hotels have they built? On the other hand the thriving towns of Sussex, Petticoche, Moncton, Sussex, Amherst, Truro, and Campbellton, several of them important industrial centres, are mainly the creation of the Intercolonial. And what would St John, Halifax or Sydney, or the great coal industry be today but for the Government Railway?

It would be too much to say that the Intercolonial management has done all that might have been done for the country traversed by that road. But the new Board of Management is understood to be giving attention to that matter and may yet effect something more in the near future. The Intercolonial management is blamed for some things for which it is not blameworthy. It is not blameworthy for the circuitous route of the road, which was adopted, not for commercial or engineering needs but for military reasons, and adds to the cost of carrying through traffic.

The road was not built with a prospect of large money-making, so much as to bind the eastern to the western Provinces, provide for the country's defence and to give Quebec, Ontario and the west an outlet over British soil in winter, when the St Lawrence is frozen up. These purposes it has served admirably. Yet those who complain most when the road fails to make income and outlay meet, are the

people of the inland Provinces whose interests is carried to St John and Halifax at bare cost or less. The local traffic has always paid well. Meanwhile the canals, which cost as much as the Intercolonial are maintained free of tolls for American and Canadian traffic alike.

The Intercolonial is not responsible for the stagnant condition of the Maritime Provinces as to growth in population or industry. That condition must be laid at the door of the high protective tariff in the first place, and in the second place to the manner in which both parties when in power have lavished expense in the west and advertised the prairie country to lure our people away from their homes. The sectional immigration policy of the past twenty-five years has imposed a burden upon Eastern Canada, from which we have reaped little but loss.

It is intimated that the Ottawa Government will take power by legislation to purchase and operate the branch lines of the Intercolonial, thus adopting in whole or in part Mr Emmerson's policy in regard. There are hundreds of miles of these roads, half of them in wretched condition, and their purchase, even at a low valuation, along with the cost of bringing them up to the Government Railway standard would add many millions to the country's rapidly growing debt. Is it wise to do this?
