ONTARIO ICHABOD.

At Confederation and for some time after Ontario was strong in political leaders in both the great parties. On the Conservative side were Sir John Macdonald, Sir Alexander Campbell, Hon. William McDougall and others, while the Liberals had men of such distinguished talent as Hon. Messrs Blake, Mackenzie, Mowat, and Cartwright. From 1867 to 1887, whether Conservatives or Liberals were in power the Great Lake Province supplied both the leader of the Government and the leader of the Opposition. After twenty years the leadership of the Opposition fell away to Quebec, when Laurier succeeded Blake in that position, and in 1891 the Premiership followed with Abbott succeeding Macdonald. Since then, with exception of Bowell's brief and not brilliant term as Premier, Ontario has not supplied a leader to either party.

Today Quebec holds the leadership of the party in power and Nova Scotia that of the Opposition. Of three men who hold the largest control in the Government of the day—Laurier, Ferguson and Sifton—not one holds an Ontario seat. Nor is there an Ontario man in the first rank of the Opposition. Death and old age have removed the sceptre once held by Ontario, Macdonald the Great, George Brown, Mackenzie, Mowat.

Blacks, Campbell, Mills, McDougall have gone the way of all the earth. Blake has long since removed to London. Cartwright and Scott have grown old. Mulock, an excellent departmental official, is not a great leader of men. Ontario grows rich by her splendid agriculture and flourishing manufactures, but has lost her political pre-eminence. Her glory of former years is departed. Wealth has accumulated but men have decayed. For the present "Ichabod" is inscribed upon her gates.

To the Czar's interesting young family of four daughters, the eldest of whom is nine years old has now been added a son and heir who will bear the title of Czarevitch. Hitherto there was no heir to the crown in the direct line, as a daughter of the Czar cannot succeed to the throne. It was a singular fatality that sent to the bottom of the sea at Port Arthur the great Russian battleship Czarevitch on the same day that a Czarevitch was born at St. Petersburg.

The Commonwealth of Australia has had almost as much trouble as old Canada had in selecting its capital, but a recent despatch tells that an agreement has at last been reached. Dalgety is the place selected, and has not now 300 people, while it is also 32 miles from the nearest railway station. Dalgety is situated 206 miles south of Sydney and not far from the boundary between New South Wales and Victoria. The respective large capitals of these two states are so mutually jealous that neither Sydney nor Melbourne could be selected without giving offence to the other, and hence the choice of Dalgety which lies approximately midway between the two. Railway connection and population also will be assured to the new capital by the time its public buildings are ready for occupation.

A Highland Chieftain.

The chieftainship of a Highland clan is still a great position, even in these levelling days; and where there is a doubt as to who is entitled to it, the adherents of the rival chiefs uphold their respective claims with a quite mediaeval ardor. It would be a bold Southron who would venture to adjudicate on the competing claims of the Mackintosh and Cluny Macpherson to the chieftainship of the Clan Chattan; and even Lord Lovat, who was the recipient last week, at the hands of his fellow-Frasers, of a splendid silver casket, in recognition of his patriotic services, is not universally (though very generally) held to be the chief of his famous clan. Lord Saltoun, head of the Aberdeenshire Frasers, is understood to assert his right to the chieftainship; and when, in the great hall of Beaufort Castle, the clansmen mustered, some years ago, round the youthful Lord Lovat, and congratulated him on his majority, Lord Saltoun (though one of the house party at the castle) sternly declined to take any part in a ceremonial which seemed to imply recognition of the claim of his brother-Peer to be the chief of their common clan.—London Chronicle.

Owing to the association with Dean Swift the house and land were sold on the basis of a rental of £11, the ordinary rental being estimated at £5.—London Mail.

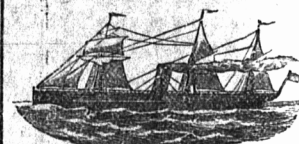
