MANILA, Dec. 14.—The flagship Heron of the United States Asiatic fleet, was preparing today to depart for Hong Kong tomorrow in connection with the situation at Canton, where Sun Yat Sen, South China leader, recently threatened to seize the customs house. Five destroyers sailed for Hong Kong yesterday. It was understood warships of the various powers will keep close watch on Canton developments and will prevent Sun from carrying out his threat of taking over the customs revenues.

The girl's companion immediately communicated with the parents.

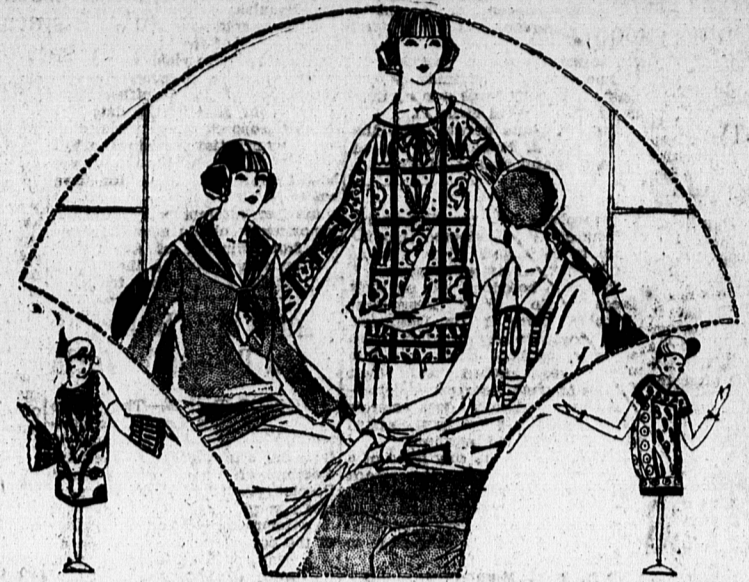
