A SERMON GOD AND MY SOUL

WEeping OVER THE CITY

The Soul Has an Infinite Value—Jerusalem A Type of Man's Immortal Part.

And when He drew near, seeing the city, He wept over it.—Luke, xix., 41. There is no more pathetic sight than Christ, the Master, shedding tears of sorrow over the ill-fated City of Jerusalem. As He came in from Bethany that bright Sunday morning and descended the slope of Mount Olivet He saw the beautiful city, with its temple and marble palaces glittering in the morning sun.

With His divine mind He remembered all that He had done through a thousand years and more for His chosen people, how He had segregated them apart from the rest of the world, how He had followed after them in their wanderings, had called them back within paths of rectitude and had watched over them with the fondest care, so that He could say, "What more is there that I could have done?" And still, after it all they were about to reject Him and condemn Him to an ignominious death. The thought of it all overpowered His human feelings, and He sat down by the roadside and a flood of tears filled His eyes and a choking sob constrained His voice and an oppressive sorrow filled His heart.

The City of Jerusalem is a type of the human soul. Beautiful beyond compare is the soul. "Thou art all fair and I will fix mine eyes on thee." It has been the object of solicitude care in the divine mind from all eternity. The wealth of divine grace has been lavished on it. The providence of God has watched over it in all its wanderings, in the paths of iniquity as well as in virtue, and no desire is deeper in the divine heart than that it shall enjoy eternal beatitude.

In pagan times there was no account taken of human souls. Most men were but animals, with few, if any, rights, and were treated as such. Ancient history is very largely a catalogue of cruelties. Amenman, the librarian of Rameses, asks, "What is the life of a peasant?" and he compares him to the locust, that may be killed by the thousands. The Assyrian monarch wrote on the stones of Nineveh:—"I took as my prisoners men, young and old. Of some I cut the hands and feet; others I mutilated. Of young men's ears I made a heap and of old men's skulls a tower." Children I burned in the flame." Paganism set no value on human life, because it did not recognize the worth of the human soul, and it was not until the Christian religion proclaimed the divine creation and the supernatural redemption of man that the tremendous value of human life was recognized and the marvellous worth of the individual soul as such was affirmed.

The central teaching of Christianity is that the human soul is of infinite value. It makes no difference whether it be the soul of the magnificent Leo or that of the most despised slave; it is of infinite value and its ruin and eternal loss draw tears of sorrow from the God who came from heaven to redeem it.

The human soul, that which each of us possesses and which makes us what we are, is first of all, the handiwork of God. It is created by an Architect of infinite wisdom whose artistic resources are boundless. There were no limitations placed to His ability in forming so beautiful a thing, and He utilized the wealth of His power in fashioning it. He took no earthly model to form it by, but He made it up to His own image and likeness—a little less than the angels, crowning it with honor and glory. The Sacred Word speaks of its creation as the breathing out of the being of God. The body of man was formed from the slime of the earth, but God breathed into its face the breath of life and man became a living being. The first time God breathed the Word that He spoke was the Son of God, equal with the Father in all things. God breathes again, and this time it is a human soul that is formed. Finally not only is man's soul created by an omnipotent God and watched over by a solicitous providence, but it is destined to live forever. As soon as we attach the note of immortality to the meanness thing, it becomes of wondrous worth. A flower, though it is an exquisitely beautiful thing, still, because it fades to-morrow we think little of it; but give it an everlasting life and it becomes of infinite value. The soul will live forever, though the things about us come and go. They have their periods of birth, perfection and decadence. Still, my soul will never die.

Little wonder that a God came from the skies to redeem it. Little wonder that the consuming thought of His life was that the wandering sheep of the fold of Israel might be brought back. Little wonder that He stood by the well and talked with the Samaritan woman and told her "all that she had done," that He received the penitent Magdalen and forgave her all her sins because "she had loved much," or that He wept

MUNROE DOCTRINE AGAN AIRED BY THE PRESIDENT

He Says the Republic is Not Aggressive but Must be Firm—A Great Navy, the First Need to Show the World That its Principles Will be Upheld at any cost.

East Northfield, Mass., Sept. 2.—While no aggression is intended under the Munroe doctrine President Roosevelt to-day imposed upon the people of the country that the time-honored principle must never be considered only as a boast. On the contrary, the nation ever will have to be in a position to back up its words with action, and by being the most powerful power in the world compel respect of its principles by every government in the world.

BIG NAVY THE FIRST NEED. A great navy—one that can enforce any declaration the government may make—is the first necessary, according to the President. However, he said, the government's policy must be one of courtesy and friendship toward all powers—the same that we intend they shall show to the United States.

This exposition of the administration views on the Munroe doctrine was made in the President's address at Proctor, Vt., where Mr. Roosevelt spoke from the steps of Senator Proctor's residence.

AGGRESSIVE TOWARD NO NATION. The president said: "We believe in the Munroe doctrine, not as a means of aggression at all. It does not mean that we are aggressive toward any power. It means merely that the biggest power on the continent, we remain steadfastly true to the principle first formulated under the Presidency of Munroe, through John Quincy Adams—the principle that this continent must not be treated as a subject for political colonization by any European power. "As I say, that is not an aggressive doctrine. It is a doctrine of peace, a doctrine of defence, a doctrine to secure
