SPICY MOLASSES COOKIES

2 cups sifted enriched flour
1/2 teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1/2 cup shortening (at room temperature)
1 egg
1/2 cup molasses
Sift together 1 1/2 cups of the flour, soda, salt, cinnamon, and nutmeg into bowl. Add shortening (at room temperature), sugar, egg and molasses. Beat with electric mixer at medium speed for about 2 minutes, or with large wooden spoon until smooth and well blended. Add remaining one-half cup flour and mix well. Chill dough for at least one-half hour. Roll out to one-quarter-inch thickness on

That Body Of Yours

DIABETES OR JUST A NERVOUS WATER DRINKER

When an individual finds himself drinking a lot of water and passing urine many times through the day and all through the night, it is only natural that he should suspect that he is developing diabetes mellitus. However, an examination of the urine shows no sugar present, and examination of the blood shows that it contains only the normal amount needed for its various duties.

What then is the trouble when the individual drinks a lot of water and passes a lot of urine which is free of sugar?

In most cases, false diabetes (diabetes insipidus), is present due to lack of one of the juices of the posterior or back portion of the pituitary gland lying on the floor of the skull. By giving a little of this juice—pitressin—daily to individuals suffering from diabetes insipidus, drinking large quantities of water and passing large quantities of urine cease. A small quantity of pitressin in powder form—small blade or half-leaf—snuffed or blown up the nose night and morning is enough to keep these persons free of symptoms.

Dr. Edward H. Ryerson, Mayo Clinic, in "Medical Clinics of North America" states that some patients who are "supposed" to have diabetes insipidus in reality are only nervous water drinkers. "For one reason or another their habit of drinking large quantities of water or other fluids has developed. Only occasionally do they drink as much as the patient who has diabetes insipidus and practically never do they drink as much during the night."

A patient who has diabetes insipidus may drink as much or more during the night as during the day, sometimes arising to drink and pass urine eight or ten times at night. The nervous drinker may not have to arise at all during the night.

The thought, then, is that if you find yourself drinking too often and passing urine too often, consult your physician for a urine and blood test. If no real diabetes—diabetes insipidus—is present, and there is no bladder irritation from food or drugs, then you have diabetes insipidus or are just a nervous water drinker.
