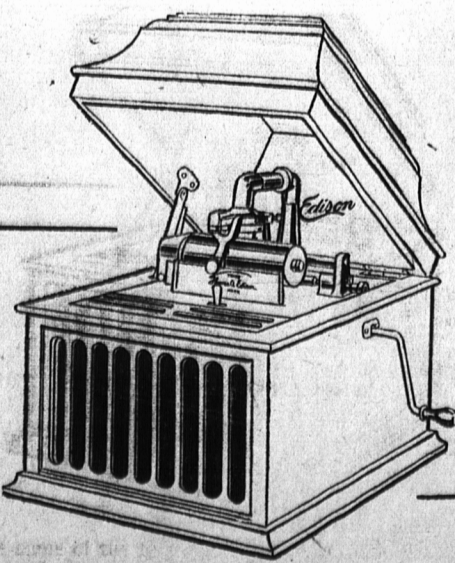

After being wounded he lay on the field for some hours before being taken to a base hospital, where he spent about two weeks, he was later taken over to England where he remained until the middle of February, when he was sent home on a three months furlough, arriving in St. John on March 5th. Pvt. Gallant has been through some of the fiercest of the fighting right in the firing line. Yesterday Pvt. Gallant arrived in Summerside most of his time being spent around the different barracks where he gave the boys of the 105th Battalion an interesting story of the work which the latter will shortly be at.—C.

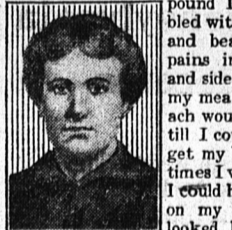

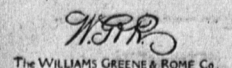
