SHIPMENT OF BULLS FOR NEWFOUNDLAND — Yesterday Mr. B. R. Brown of Little York, Messrs Simmons Bros., and the Experimental Station made a shipment of Ayrshire bulls to the order of the Government of Newfoundland. Mr. Brown shipped two sixteen months old beauties, Messrs Simmons one twenty-two months old, and the Experimental Station one fifteen months old bull. This is the first export of Ayrshire bulls for several years and were selected by the Department of Agriculture on the order of the Newfoundland Government. It may be mentioned that Mr. Brown had an excellent offer for one of his bulls from a Quebec breeder who decided to purchase it in preference to many Quebec bulls on the recommendation of the Secretary of the Canadian Ayrshire Breeders Association who had recently visited the island and inspected Mr. Brown's stock. However Mr. Brown had already closed with the Newfoundland Government at the same figure offered from Quebec.

CALCUTTA COMING. — The Calcutta Chronicle speaks very glowingly of the concert given by the concert troop of the H. M. S. Calcutta while in Halifax and says the programme consisted of songs, character sketches, choruses and readings. With the exception of one or two numbers the entire programme was given to burlesque, clever, rollicking, and farcical readings and character sketches given by men who possess far more than the ordinary faculty of amateur elocutionists, but showed deep rooted histrionic ability. Finally the programme ends with a dashing chorus, which few could resist humming, and many will long carry with them. "Don't let me scrap the British Navy." This was an anti climax for the house stormed for more. The Calcutta is due here on Friday next.
