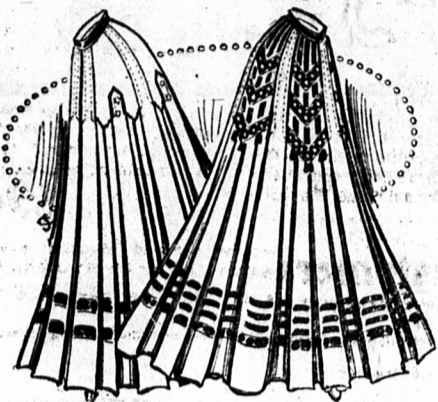

rary statement does not know or does not care what kind of a statement he makes.

There is, however, one country in the world which affords gentlemen opposite some consolation. For many years the exports of the United States of America have been much larger than the imports and it has been one of the great, progressive nations of the world. But the progress of that country is not due to its foreign trade, but due to the enormous internal development, the development of almost limitless natural resources and the exceedingly large immigration into that country of the best blood of Europe, the young, the strong, the vigorous, the healthy, the energetic and the ambitious from every country in the world. The hon. member for North Toronto has supplied an argument which will go a long way to show why the exports of that country are greater than its imports. The people of that country have become very wealthy in consequence, I believe, of their internal trade and their great internal development. The hon. member for North Toronto referred to that. Wealthy Americans are now residing permanently abroad, travelling in large numbers. The hon. member said that millions upon millions went out of that country every year to support these gentlemen in other countries. All the bills of exchange which are drawn upon London banks generally and which are sent to these gentlemen to support their relatives in other countries, Europe, or in Canada, or wherever they may reside or travel, have to be met by the exports of the country. That is the argument of the hon. member for North Toronto. It is not original, but it is sound. It would be difficult indeed to tell how many millions this sum amounts to. There is another large item to which the hon. member for North Toronto did not allude. I have reference to the millions of people, young, energetic, vigorous, ambitious, strong, healthy, hardy, coming from every country in the world, but particularly from Europe, who make their homes in the United States of America. They generally succeed there and they generally leave behind them poor, needy, indigent relatives to whom they send monthly, quarterly, or yearly remittances. These remittances may be small in individual cases, but in the aggregate they amount to immense sums. I know some banks in Boston and New York which have not much other business except the selling of these small drafts which are remitted to European countries, and yet these banks do a very large business. How many million dollars go out in that way I do not know, but it must be met by the exports of the country. Whether these two items will be sufficient to account for the balance of trade, I do not know, but I do know that they would be sufficient to account for a very large part of it. So much for the balance of trade. When we find ourselves with our reserves increasing, when we find our savings banks and the chartered banks increasing also, with an increase in the manufactured products of this country and in the manufacturing plants which turn out these products; when we find an increase in farm machinery, an increase in capital of every kind and degree; when we find that going on all over Canada we can very safely assume that we are doing a profitable business.

Now, Sir, a word or two with regard to the Transcontinental Railway. Some of these hon. gentlemen opposite have been so unfair as to try to make it appear that the right hon. the Prime Minister stated that \$13,000,000 would build the Transcontinental Railway. Of course they know better. They know that was a misrepresentation of the grossest kind, on the part of whoever accused the Prime Minister of making such a statement. Even the member for North Toronto (Mr. Foster) in speaking upon the question and in referring to this very case said that he believed the cost would be nearer \$30,000,000 than \$13,000,000, and taking it for granted that the hon. member (Mr. Foster) was right let us consider what we will have for this \$30,000,000 when we have the Transcontinental Railway. Compare that bargain with the bargain made by the Conservative government and the Canadian Pacific Railway Company. They gave the Canadian Pacific Railway 25,000,000 acres of land, over \$63,000,000 of dollars in cash and completed railway; they gave the Canadian Pacific Railway an empire in land and the revenues of a

kingdom in cash. And besides the Conservative government gave the Canadian Pacific Railway other enormous privileges such as the privilege of exemption from taxation of all the property of the railway for ever in this country; they gave the Canadian Pacific Railway the privilege of exemption from taxation on all their land for 20 years after the patents had been issued; they gave them the privilege of importing free of duty all the material that entered into the construction of the road. And, Sir, when the railway was completed we did not own a rail or a tie of it, and we denuded ourselves of control over the freight rates until the Canadian Pacific Railway had reached the point when it earned 10 per cent of its capital. On the other hand take the bargain that the Liberal government made with the Grand Trunk Pacific and even supposing the cost of it to be \$30,000,000 as stated by the hon. member for North Toronto, still that is less than two years' surplus under Liberal rule. And what have we got for that? We have got a railway from ocean to ocean opening up town sites, and bringing into development millions of acres of mineral lands, and timber lands, and rich agricultural lands, and also whose line hundreds of thousands of Canadians will settle and make their homes, and become producers and consumers and return to the exchequer of this country many times over, the cost of that railway. We have not given a grant of duty on the land to the Grand Trunk outside of what is absolutely necessary for the road beds and terminals, and when that railroad is finished we will own it from Winnipeg to Moncton, and it will be an asset of this country for all future years. Compare that bargain made by this government with the bargain which the Conservatives made with the Canadian Pacific Railway Company. Sir, I do not think there is any one thing which will show the present Government to better advantage than will that comparison. I believe that Canadians yet unborn and cities yet un-built will do honour to the memory of the man who had the courage, the knowledge, the wisdom, the prescience to conceive and carry through this great scheme, a scheme that actually gives us another Canada that gives transportation facilities to the great west, that opens up the hinterland of our country, and which will contribute largely to the greatness of the noble country Canada is destined to be.
