BIG DEMAND FOR GAS STOVES.

People Trying to Avoid Use of Coal as Fuel Wood May be Used in Many Cases.

NEW YORK, Sept. 29.—Should the coal strike continue for a long time the indications are that there will be a big demand for gas stoves, according to the dealers in them. When asked if the coal strike lasted for several months the use of gas as a fuel would be increased. Secretary Besson of the Mutual Gas Company said that he supposed it would. He went on: "The price of gas in this city, as everybody knows, is fixed by law. We must pay any price for the material of which we make gas, but we must sell gas at a fixed price. Of course we have contracts for large supplies of coal, but they all contain the strike clause, and when the contractors refuse to give us any more coal at contract prices, because of the strike, we must make new contracts."

The reports that the farmers of Long Island and other places were cutting cord wood because of the high prices of coal, many people in the larger cities are anxious to know if they cannot substitute such fuel for coal and thereby become independent of the coal companies as the agriculturalists. Several of the larger dealers in wood in this city report that the entire population could be supplied with wood if necessary and at prices that would make it almost as cheap as coal.

GERMAN PHYSICIANS MUST CUT THEIR BEARDS.

The German Emperor has issued his command, and the doctors must now cut off their beards. The Emperor's own physician as well as the Empress's and their assistants will be obliged to shave, and the army surgeons may next expect to receive their orders. The cause of all this stir, of course, is the dangerous microbe. The creatures, it is found, attach themselves easily to a physician's beard or mustache, when he examines his patient's throat, etc. and it is possible then for him to carry off the disease in his beard to some other person. Two German professors and a French professor have studied the matter thoroughly, and the former goes so far as to say that a skull cap should be worn by the physician in the sick room.—Ret. Druggist.

NEW WARSHIP PLANS.

Improvements to be Accepted in the New Second Class Cruisers.

LONDON, Sept. 30.—Important departures in the construction of warship are contemplated in the plans which the British Admiralty has adopted for the improved type of a second-class cruiser. These novelties are said to amount to a veritable revolution in cruiser architecture, which carried to its logical conclusion, will make men-of-war designed to prey on commerce equal in fighting strength to battleships, both as regards size and speed.

The armor equipment of the new vessels will rival cruisers of the first-class. Their most radical characteristics will be their armor protected decks and heavily armoured conning towers. In addition it is proposed to supply them with a special equipment to break the force of torpedo attacks.

Commenting on the Admiralty's plans James Dunn naval director of the firm of Vickers, Sons & Maxim, limited, said to a Chicago Record correspondent: "We have no access to the Government's patterns, but we presume that the innovations will be introduced into King Alfred, Good Hope, and Leviathan, the trio of Her Majesty's new cruisers now building. Improvement is always the order of the day in English naval architecture."

Governor Jones, General Biscoe and Mayor Hamilton will do all they can to make the occasion a stirring and memorable one.

THE ENORMOUS INCREASE IN COAL CONSUMPTION.

In spite of continued effort to increase the efficiency of engines and boilers, the progress of invention is such that coal is becoming each year a more and more important article of commerce. So a short time ago, viewing the history of the world, as 1831, the annual coal production of Great Britain was 24,000,000 tons; for the year 1901 the coal production will probably be 240,000,000 tons, an increase of 1,000 per cent. In 1831 the population of Great Britain was 25,000,000, and the next census, 1901, will probably show about 40,000,000 in that country, an increase of 60 per cent. in 70 years. Therefore the production of coal has increased from one ton per capita to six tons, and the rate of increase has been 15 times as great as the rate of increase in population. In 1849 the production of bituminous coal in the United States was between 1,000,000 and 2,000,000 tons, and production of anthracite was 1,000,000 tons—say a total of 2,500,000 tons. At that time the population of the country was 17,000,000 so that there was probably less than one-sixth of a ton used per capita.

Compare that with the present tonnage of 220,000,000 and a population of approximately 75,000,000, and it will be seen that America is now using per capita eighteen times as much coal as she did sixty years ago. In fact, since 1860 the per capita increase has been 51 per cent.—F. E. Saward, in The Engineering Magazine for October.

WANTS TO STOP CHEAP GAS.

Stockholder in the People's Gas Company of Chicago Objects to Gas at 40 Cents.

CHICAGO, September 27.—Nathan George a Connecticut man owning 100 shares of stock in the People's Gas Light and Coke Company, to-day further complicated the gas war here by filing a bill in the United States circuit court, asking for an injunction restraining the People's Gas Company from selling gas at 40 cents per 1,000 feet.

RAW SUGAR SHORTAGE OVER.

NEW YORK, Sept. 22.—The steamship Kentucky, from Hamburg, via Boston, has arrived at Brooklyn, and is now putting off 15,000 bags of beet sugar consigned to the Arbuckles, and 5,500 bags for the American Sugar Refining Company. The Norwegian steamship Thordis is discharging 16,000 baskets of Java sugar. The other vessels laden with Java sugar are expected. Their arrival will relieve the scarcity of raw sugar, the stocks of which is now reduced to 68,000 tons all told.
