OBITUARY.—Long River's oldest resident has passed away in the person of Donald Cameron, who died at his home on Saturday, Dec 7th in the 90th year of his age. Mr. Cameron until the past few months was wonderfully smart. Until very recently he was able to walk to the office a distance of nearly two miles for the mail. No man was better read or capable of better judgement on the issues of the day; his keeping abreast of the times was marvellous for a man of his age. He indeed carried youth into old age and being in his company it was difficult to tell where the one ended and the other began. Having a good education himself he sought for others the same benefit and in his day did possibly more than any other to advance the cause of education in the settlement. Mr. Cameron's life partner Margaret Pickering survives him. They were married nearly 63 years ago and it is questionable if there is on the whole island a couple who have been spared so long to enjoy each others company (at least none more harmonious and happy.) They were blessed with a large family, seven sons and five daughters. All were spared to grow up to manhood and womanhood without a break (but are now scattered far.) One since has found rest on a foreign shore and now fall of years and respected by all the aged father was laid to rest in the Presbyterian Cemetery of New London where for the first time his son was required to select a plot for the family burial. The funeral on Monday was largely attended, the service being conducted by Rev. Mr. Smith.
