As announced in the REVIEW last week, W. Travis Deatherage, of Brighton, Ill., has leased from Col. James Westwater, of Columbus, O., the stallion, Todd Mac 2.073. Followers of the Grand and Great circuits will remember, with a splendid trotter when he was racing. He is a superb type full made, powerful, and highly finished, and was an attractively gaited, game, fast trotter. His stud career promises to make him one of the leading sons of Todd 2.14%, for, while he had been sired to only a few mares up to 1913, he has sired sensational speed with regularity. His three-year-old daughter, Anna Bradford 2.00%, is the world's champion three-year-old filly and undefeated in 1914. This season his sons, Todd Temple 2.09% and Tommy (Todd) 2.24%, raced on the Grand Circuit, and both beat 2.08 a number of times. There was a lot of others that have shown speed, and within another year the Todd Mac boom will be at its height. Mr. Deatherage is one of the best known Illinois breeders and owned, among other horses, the noted sire, Boreal 2.15%. Owners can be assured that Mr. Deatherage will give their mares every attention. Todd Mac is the sire of Dr. I. T. Jenkins' colt Upton Prince, Princess Sam Yacataia by Arion is the dam of several fast ones, last season. Ferrozzone of here only three weeks out of the pasture trotted several halves better than 1.10 and a full mile in 2.26%. Prince has been rather unfortunate as a two-year-old his trainer met with an accident yet with little handling he won the 2 year old race in both Halifax and Fredericton. As a three-year-old, he was lame. In his four-year-old form he took distemper and consequently did nothing, he seems after a winters rest to promise well and his trainer expects him to beat 2.20 this fall.
