(By J. F. Sanderson, Canadian Press Staff Writer) LONDON, March 10—(CP)—Great Britain patched up an incipient quarrel with Italy over detention of Italian coal ships during a weekend of diplomatic suspense in the European capitals.

Britain traded 13 grimy Italian coal carriers with their cargoes of German coal for renewed trade negotiations with Rome. In return Italy agreed to import no more German coal by sea.

Authoritative sources expressed conviction that the trade talks which will be renewed in Rome in a day or two would lead to a comprehensive agreement for an exchange of Welsh coal for Italian munitions, vegetables and fruits.

The decision was announced a few hours before Joachim Von Ribbentrop, the German Foreign Minister, arrived in Rome for conversations with Premier Mussolini and President Roosevelt's "fact-finding" reporter, Sumner Welles, landed in London after flying from Paris. It was taken as a diplomatic setback for Von Ribbentrop who was expected to use the strained relations between Rome and London as an argument in favor of resumption of the Rome-Berlin axis, which weakened considerably when Berlin signed its non-aggression pact with Moscow.

PARIS, March 10—(AP)—Northern France was held under an air raid alarm for 1 1/2 hours today during a spurt in war activity. On the western front land forces engaged in several encounters, during which German patrols, the high command reported, "had to fall back under our fire."

Planes Fly Dynamite To Wood Islands

(By Canadian Press Staff Writer) HALIFAX, March 10—(CP)—Prime Minister Mackenzie King gave British aircraft purchasing agents two years ago the impression that "Canada might be neutral if there was a war and, if it was neutral, their orders might not be filled if a war actually took place."
