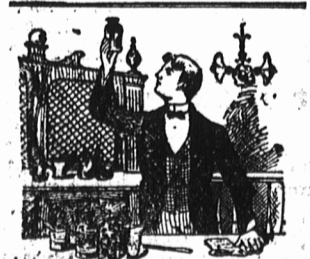

THE GREAT AND THE SMALL.

On every hand the exploration of science multiplies the wonders of the universe. On the one hand it has divided the invisible atom into dancing ions; on the other hand it affirms that the visible universes is made up of suns with probably attendant planets, and these suns, according to Sir David Gill's recent announcement, are moving in two great "star streams" in opposite directions. But all this concerns merely the visible universe with its millions of suns, and this but a small part of the total universe.

The telescope multiplies the worlds that are visible to the naked eye, and the more powerful and space-penetrating the glass, the more worlds and systems are revealed. The imagination reels in trying even to conceive of limitless space. It is as much beyond human comprehension as infinity or eternity. The finite mind seeks always to find an end, an outward boundary—"the walls that close the universe with crystal in"—and then asks of itself what lies beyond those walls!

"Life expresses itself in action, motion and the great life of the universe is, curiously, the same in its manifestation as the infinitely small life of the atom, because of a rotary motion of its ions—a fact as astonishing and overwhelming to the imagination as the rotation of the suns." The moon revolves about the earth, the earth and its sister planets about a star. The motion of our own system may be typical of one that pertains throughout creation. Is it possible that gravitation is concerned in such stupendous movements and distances? If so what is gravitation?

So far as science has penetrated the mystery of the material universe there is order permeating its infinite variety. Is then the stupendous whole revolving round a common centre? Or is it possible that there can be a centre in a space that is infinite? The centre is at least as unknown as is the outer boundary of the universe and apparently as unlikely of human discovery. The star streams which Sir David Gill has announced are almost certainly not the last of the great revolutions in the universe, for they concern merely its visible part, which is but a fraction of the whole creation.

The Montreal Witness sagely draws the inference that the reason for the attack of the Liberal press upon Mr. Bourassa, and why stones are thrown at him on the platform is "that Mr. Bourassa has something to tell that the Liberal party cannot afford to have the people hear."

The British government is about to lay down two new battleships, each of two thousand tons greater displacement than the famous Dreadnought and armed with 18 1/2 inch guns instead of the 12 inch guns of that famous ship. These will discharge shells of 1,250 pounds, as compared with the 850 pound shell of the 12 inch gun.

Rev. A. B. Simpson, now of New York, but who was born in Cavendish in this Province, still retains the marvellous power he has long possessed of moving men to empty their pockets for worthy objects. Nearly ten thousand people listened to him at Old Orchard, Maine, on Sunday last, and the collections for missions totaled \$92,378.

THE NORTHWEST HARVEST.


The grain crops in the Canadian Northwest cover an area so vast that no greater mistake could be made than to judge of the whole by the report from the single section. From the eastern boundary of Manitoba to the western bounds of Alberta is approximately a thousand miles, and the extreme breadth of the harvest fields from the American boundary to Edmonton is fully three hundred miles.

So one might as well attempt to judge of the crops in Prince Edward Island by conditions reported in Central Ontario, as to suppose that all the Northwest crops are even approximately alike. In one respect only is there a similarity—the harvest will be later than usual by two weeks or more. Some large sections have suffered from lack of rain. Smaller sections have had too much rain. There has been vast diversity in weather conditions and there are also considerable diversities of soil and climate in this vast region.

The Winnipeg Free Press tells that the time when wheat harvesting will begin in different sections will range from August 15 to September 25. In reports from 54 sections 38 reports quote September dates for the beginning. Some sections have suffered from drought. The Free Press reports in Southern Manitoba a probable crop of 10 to 12 bushels per acre, but adds that "in this section thousands of acres that had not reached a height of more than six inches were plowed down and the land summer fallowed."

Telegraphic reports also regrettably tell of thousands of acres of good crops in other sections utterly destroyed by hail. These are but small areas compared with the whole, however. Fine hot weather, and a holding off of the frost till the 10th or middle of September is a necessity for 80 per cent of the crop in Saskatchewan and Alberta. It may yet turn out good, but as the Free Press puts it, much worry as well as much virtue lies in an "It." If the frost holds off, as we hope it may, the late crop will yet show a good yield. But this will not restore what has been destroyed by drought and hail, of course.

Under the new constitution of the Senate of the Dominion of New Zealand women are eligible to seats in that body. Not all the members of Parliament were willing for this, but the measure passed by a vote of 37 to 25. The women vote on the same terms as the men in New Zealand and no doubt a wholesome respect for the feminine vote paved the way to his seats in the Senate.
