Butterfat Bonus To Be Continued

OTTAWA, July 15—(CP)—Payment of the six-cent-a-pound subsidy on butterfat to primary producers will continue as long as it is considered necessary. Hon. J. G. Taggart, federal minister of Agriculture, said today in a statement.

Dr. G. S. H. Barton, Federal Deputy Minister of Agriculture, discussed the diversion to butter production of other dairy product manufacturing facilities. Newspaper Work Now Listed As A War Industry

OTTAWA, July 14—(CP)—Newspapermen have been listed under section 15 of the National War Services regulations. This section provides that from time to time the Minister may furnish to selective boards lists of industrial or servicing activities deemed to be essential to the successful prosecution of the war. An employee engaged in any activity so listed is termed a "war industry."

Newspapermen coming under the listing are defined as follows:

"Members of editorial staffs, including editorial executives, reporters, technical men and artisans and other men whose services are essential to getting out newspapers, weeklies, monthlies and other publications."

In connecting with the listing, war services Minister Thorson said today:

"The listing of any activity under section 15 does not mean automatic postponement of service for the persons engaged in that activity. On the listing of any activity under section 15, the board has power to entertain and deal with applications for postponement. Each case will be dealt with by the appropriate board on its merits and in the light of the facts surrounding the application for postponement."

U. S. Warns Vichy Re French Warships

WASHINGTON, July 15—(AP)—While Axis forces drove toward Alexandria this month, President Roosevelt twice proposed to Vichy that seven French warships there be removed, and twice the proposals were rejected by the state department disclosed today.

The rejections were in the face of a warning from the President that the proposals were accepted by British authorities would be justified in ordering the warships out of the port through the nearby Suez Canal, and if the orders were disregarded, in destroying the vessels to prevent their falling into enemy hands.

Summer Welles, acting secretary of state, dismissing the moves at a press conference today, emphasized that the proposals were made with the aim of safeguarding the ships for the remainder of the war and insuring their return to France afterward.

On July 3 Mr. Roosevelt suggested to Vichy that the warships, immobilized at Alexandria after the Franco-German armistice of 194
