CHARLOTTETOWN AND ELSEWHERE

It pays to buy in this Province (From Saturday's Evening Guardian) Miss Grace Dutcher, Charlottetown, has returned from a visit to Crapaud.

The marriage of Miss Beatrice, youngest daughter of G. H. and Mrs. Holbrook, Charlottetown, to Wilfred G. Taylor, son of G. H. and Mrs. Taylor, takes place on Wednesday, the 11th inst.

Saturday the eastern express arrived in Charlottetown at 8.20 a. m., five minutes late; the southern express at 9.35 a. m., ten minutes late; the Cape Traverse accommodation at 10.00 a. m., five minutes late, and the Tignish accommodation at 11.45 a. m., five minutes late.

There passed away on Aug. 13th at Bear River Line Road Thomas Gallant at the ripe old age of 80 years. Deceased was ailing for some time and death was not unexpected. He leaves to mourn besides a sorrowing widow, five sons and one daughter: Mrs. Peter McDonald, Bear River, George in Boston, Jerome in Picton, N. S., Joseph in Charlottetown, Frank in Souris and Henry at home. His remains were interred in St. Margaret's Roman Catholic Cemetery.

A Toronto despatch of the 4th inst., says that after taking evidence last night, Coroner Courie, further adjourned until the evening the inquest on Andrew McGee, of Charlottetown, P. E. I., who was drowned from a dredge in the lagoon at Centre Island last Wednesday. John Dunn, engineer on the dredge, stated that while McGee was approaching in a punt he had dropped a quantity of sand from the scoop, with the intention of splashing him. McGee's boat was struck and swamped, throwing him into the water. Two lines were thrown and the dredge lowered within his reach, but he was a good swimmer, and appeared not to need help, and continued swimming for some time, sinking as a boat was being pushed off to assist him. The fatality occurred about ten feet from shore, and in twelve feet of water. The result of an autopsy indicated that death was from drowning and there were no signs of violence, although body and clothes were smeared with sand. Dunn and McGee were evidently on perfectly good terms.

The Northumberland left Charlottetown for Picton this morning at 8.30 with a general cargo and a large number of passengers. Percy Gregory, Charlottetown, left this morning by the Northumberland for New Glasgow where he has accepted a position on the I. C. R.

The bride was given away by her uncle, Roland McNeil. After a dainty lunch she served and much merrymaking, the happy couple took the night train for P. E. Island and other maritime points of interest. On their return they will reside in their new home on Townsend Street, this city. The bride was the recipient of a large number of valuable and useful gifts. Sydney, etc. Mr. McKinley was formerly of Charlottetown and has many friends here.
