20 Killed In Plane Crash

BOWLING GREEN, Ky., July 29 (AP) - Charred bodies of 20 victims of an American airlines transport plane which plowed into a field near Nashville, Tenn., and burst into flames, were removed from the wreckage late today and brought here and to Nashville, Tenn., while the two survivors remained in a hospital here.

The crash, which took the lives of several military officers, important industrial leaders and a young mother and her baby, was being investigated by civil aeronautics board officials and representatives of the airline.

S. K. Hoffman, chief engineer of the Lexington division of American Aviation, Inc., and Lieut. Glenn Fellows, of Love Field, Texas, escaped through a kick-off window of the plane.

The plane piloted by Capt. Harry A. Stiller, of Cleveland, Ohio, according to airline officials, left Louisville, Ky., for Nashville, Tenn., at 9:54 p.m. yesterday and was last seen at 10:20 p.m. at Smith Grove, Ky. The crash occurred shortly afterwards.

Smuts Wins Smashing Vote Of Confidence

PRETORIA, July 29 (CP) - Field Marshal Smuts, Prime Minister of the Union of South Africa since the start of the war, and the Empire's veteran statesman, won a smashing vote of confidence in the July general election, incomplete returns showed tonight.

Already with 41 of the 150 seats at stake still to be reported, the Prime Minister was assured of a representation on the government benches greater than that which he has carried out his war period for almost four years.

Field Marshal Smuts himself and all his cabinet were re-elected, although one or two of the ministers had been mentioned in pre-election forecasts as in danger of defeat. All received substantial majorities in their constituencies.

Latest returns tonight showed the combined government parties had returned 85 members. In addition, the Prime Minister has the support of the three Cape Province members representing the natives who did not have to stand for reelection this year. The combined opposition, campaigning on a policy of quitting the war and ending "The British Connection" had but 24. The size of the government's majority is expected to increase to 100 as the proportions when the rest of the returns become available.

In the last house the government parties had 67 seats, including the three Cape Province members that already Smuts, with 88 members, is certain of increased support in the remote possibility that all missing seats should go to the opposition.
