U. S. Soldiers Overseas Vote To be Taken

WASHINGTON, Sept. 24 — (AP) — Preliminary steps to enable several million members of the United States armed forces to vote in the 1944 state primaries and the presidential election were taken in Congress today.

Chairman Theodore Green (Dem., R. I.) announced he had asked the Secretary of War, Henry Stimson, to call the Senate elections committee to permit the use of a simplified V-mail ballot.

As soon as the Stimson Knox statement is received, Green said he would open hearings on the proposal.

On three elections held in Canada, overseas voters have exercised a vote, but there has been no set plan evolved for this.

Under the Dominion election laws, troops overseas took part in direct elections in 1937.

It was predicted that many practical difficulties would be encountered in the varying state election laws and the complexities of distributing and assembling ballots cast in the far corners of the world.

Principal provisions of the pending legislation are: V-mail ballots, printed on paper suitable for V-mail processing, for voting for President and members of Congress.

The war and navy departments would print, distribute and assemble the ballots with commanding officers of all service units responsible for seeing that any eligible service man or woman obtained one.

An oath of eligibility would be the only legal requirement, with poll taxes and state registration laws waived.

Names of candidates would not be printed on the ballot, but the voter would write in the choice for each office from printed candidates lists supplied through the army and navy.

Ballots would be set up wherever men and women in uniform are stationed.

The V-mail ballots would be returned to the Secretaries of State in sealed envelopes for relaying to the election officials in the service man's home precinct.

Ballots reaching the home district would be counted.

This procedure would apply only in the general election of November, 1944.

Report Giraud And De Gaulle Have Quarrel

NEW YORK, Sept. 24 — (AP) — The British NBC correspondent in Algiers, tonight quoted "reliable sources" as saying that a dispute had flared between General Giraud and De Gaulle over the Corsican campaign and that De Gaulle cried: "you stole my Corsica!"

Hollenbeck reported that information indicated that the Corsican campaign began entirely as a "home grown affair, staged by Corsican patriots who had no particular interest in either general."

The correspondent quoted "reliable informants" as saying that Giraud is accused of slighting the Italian contribution made by the Italians towards the success of the Corsican campaign.

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War—25 Years Ago Today

(By The Canadian Press) SEPT. 25, 1918. On the Balkan front Vele and Iship were occupied by the Serbians while the British entered Bulgaria taking 10,000 prisoners and 200 guns.

The Bulgians request for an armistice was refused and the British occupied Strumitsa in Bulgaria.

SEPT. 26, 1918. The Franco-American advance on the Champagne-Meuse front began on a 40-mile front capturing Montfaucon, 100 prisoners and 200 guns.

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
