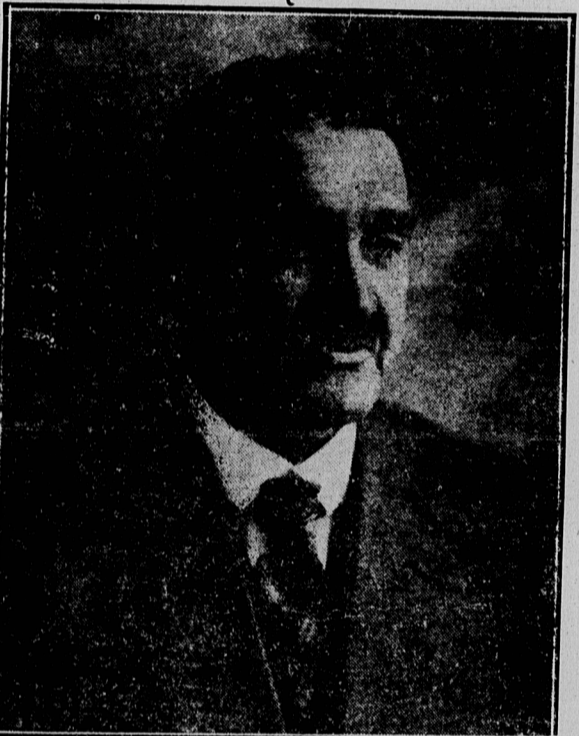

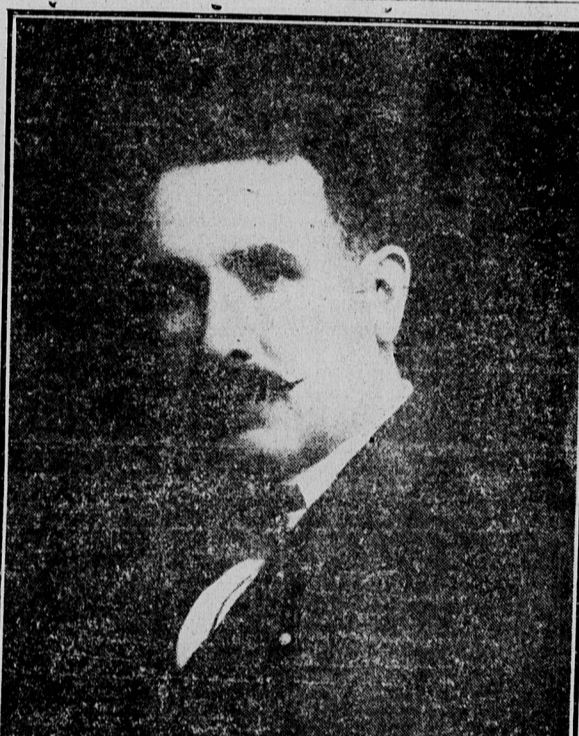
fessed to believe in a tariff for revenue only, and practiced protection when in office. Happily for them, and for the Dominion, their actions were better than their words, but nobody ever accused them of consistency. Mr. William Lyon Mackenzie King has been a low tariff advocate and, prior to the introduction of the last budget, had missed no opportunities for scaling down the tariff. His latest revision, or that of his Finance Minister, contains certain protective features which constitute, so far as they go, a repudiation of the Prime Minister's proclaimed policy, while the numerous—much more numerous—low-tariff and free trade features represent a movement which was never attempted by such great Liberal statesmen as Laurier and Fielding. There is no much evidence of consistency in this record. Perhaps consistency is a jewel not to be found in the pleadings of a hard-pressed politician and perhaps its absence will be forgiven by a public which is asked to believe that Canada imported New Zealand butter because of the prosperity brought about by the King Government, a prosperity which so increased the people's purchasing power that they were able to indulge their desire for New Zealand butter in preference to the home product. The same public may have become a little hardened upon receiving the information that great as are the exports of Canadian raw material to the United States, they are exceeded by imports from that country of raw material, notably rubber—which is, as most people are aware, a product of the British Empire and not of the United States.

Neither Mr. Bennett nor any other Conservative speaker up to the present has had the temerity to affront the intelligence of Canadians with stuff of this sort. It seems, however,

that established principle, precedent, and tradition, whether applicable to the statesmanship of the past or to present rules of public discretion, are not to be binding upon Mr. King and his associates. For example, there has recently made its appearance in Toronto a weekly publication whose mission it seems to be to promote the Liberal campaign. It contains "The Watchword of Liberalism," which opens with a reference to those elder statesmen who planned or envisaged a greater Canada. "We must act," says this Watchword, "not as these honoured leaders did, but as we conceive they would have acted under present conditions." In other words, the Liberalism of today has the capacity to improve upon the plans and methods of the Fathers of Confederation. Those who are familiar with the progress of the Dominion during the long period in which party leaders adhered to the principles laid down by the builders of the nation, and are able to contrast that progress with the rudderless drift which has marked the Dominion's course under the present Government, will likely form their own conclusion as to the wisdom of abandoning the course so broadly and surely mapped by men who planned for the future of Canada rather than for the immediate success of a political party.
