Lives of Several From Canada and United States Are Endangered.

BOSTON, Mass., Sept. 9.—The lives of many missionaries, several of whom come from the Maritime Provinces, and are sent out by the Baptist Mission Board in Toronto, Ont., are believed to be endangered by the Oher Rioters in Ching Lu in Pinca. The American Baptist foreign missionary society has its headquarters in this city. A few days ago the society officials received a cablegram from one of their missionaries stationed at Ching Lu, the capital of the Province, telling of the rioting on the part of the natives. Today another cablegram was received which said "American consul advises us to leave." Today's message has convinced the society officials here that the situation has reached an acute stage, and that the lives of the missionaries and the mission property are in danger.

CHINESE RAILWAY POLICY CAUSES GENERAL UNREST.

PEKING, Sept. 9.—Missionaries in the outlying districts of Sze-Chuen Province have been ordered by the viceroy to concentrate in the larger towns, in consequence of the general unrest among the natives arising from the government's railroad policy. All foreigners in Ching Lu the capital of Sze-Chuen Province, are taking refuge in the compound of the missionary society of the Methodist Church of Canada.

Sze-Chuen is a western province of China, bordering on Tibet. It has an area of upwards of 200,000 square miles. The region is very mountainous, some of the mountain ranges reaching a great elevation. The population is estimated at about 70,000,000 far exceeding that of any other Chinese province. The people, however, rose in protest against the railroad policy of the Chinese government. The agitation being chiefly against the construction of the Sze-Chuen Hankow Railway. This railroad is to be built with foreign capital, a loan of \$30,000,000 for this purpose having been made China by British, French, German and American bankers.

At Chennan, the capital, missionaries are maintained by the missionary society of the Methodist Church of Canada and also by the Menonite general conference of North America. Of the two outlying districts, where missionaries are working, Kin Ting is a station of the Canadian Missionary Society of the Methodist Church, and also of the American Baptist Mission Union.

LARGELY A MATTER OF POLITICAL UNREST.

TORONTO, Ont., Sept. 9.—When interviewed today regarding the disturbances reported from Ching Lu, Rev. Egerton Shore, general secretary for foreign missions was disposed to take a serious view. "It is mostly a matter of political unrest amongst themselves, the Chinese," he said, "and has really little to do with the missionaries. The latter will probably take refuge for a time with the foreign legation at Chung King, which is about 500 miles down the river."

"There is a great deal of political unrest in China at the present time," Mr. Shore continued. "It is part of the evolution of the new civilization. He then read a despatch just received from Ching Lu, which after mentioning that the missionaries were taking refuge at Chung King adds: "Think it best to postpone department of outgoing missionaries."

Mr. Shore, however, in spite of the ominous nature of this despatch reiterated his belief that the present disturbance will amount to little and that there is not much danger to missionaries. He cited some instances of his own experience in China, showing the quickness with which political disturbances are quelled there.

Including the women's missionary society, there are about twenty missionary families in Ching Lu and together about 150 foreigners, including several members of the Friend's society, some Methodists, but no Baptists.
