The cause of numerous diseases and disagreeable habits hereof are ascribed to constitutional, have been traced directly to the teeth. Biting, drooling, frothing, loss of flesh, weak eyes, driving on one rein and pulling at the bit, etc. are due to diseased and irregular teeth. Rough edges and sharp points of the teeth, irritate the mouth, and produce nervousness and irritability; uneven and elongated molars and incisors prevent the proper mastication of the food, producing indigestion and general debility. Decayed molars cause necrosis of the bone, abscesses, nasal gleet, etc. These causes should be removed. Decayed teeth should be removed by extracting or trephaning, sharp corners and rough edges should be smoothed down, and elongated and uneven molars and incisors cut off. The common float, or file heretofore deemed sufficient to accomplish this, is not sufficient but special instruments devised for the purpose are necessary.
