MAJOR MAY TO WED - The engagement is announced of Major Frederick F. May, only son of the late Robert and Henrietta May of this city, to Mabel H. the youngest daughter of the late William and Mrs. Andrew of North St. Eleanor's P. E. J. Major May is one of the original officers of the "Fighting 28th" the N. B. and P. E. I. Battalion having volunteered for active service overseas immediately on the outbreak of the late war. He was severely wounded in the operations succeeding the second battle of Ypres, near Kemel in the Ypres salient. On being invalided back to Canada he was employed on the staff of military district No. 7, St. John, N. B. and eventually on the General Headquarters Staff, Ottawa, till the end of the war. Miss Andrew is a graduate nurse, graduated at the head of her class in 1918. She at once took up the profession of nursing and her many patients will gratefully remember her tender and skillful care of them in their sickness. Her two sisters are also graduate nurses. Her eldest brother, Rev. A. E. Andrew, of Windsor, N. S. was Chaplain overseas with the Royal Canadian Regiment and won the Military Cross for his bravery under heavy fire.
