### Beam System To Aid Ships

LONDON, May 16 — Based on captured German equipment and plans developed from the beam system by which the enemy directed bombers on to British cities, a new British system of direction will enable air or sea navigators to fix their bearings accurately within 60 seconds.

The new system, known as the console aviation system, will be used in an experimental station being built at Bushmills, Northern Ireland.

Dispensing with the usual ground operators of a direction-finding station, the system enables an unlimited number of ships or aircraft to take bearings up to a range of 1,000 miles over land or 1,500 miles over sea.

Ships or aircraft need only to listen on 1,40 metres for the code signal "Seven-seven" and then count the dots and dashes which follow during the next 60 seconds.

The Bushmills station will serve the north and mid-Atlantic air routes. The system will be extended by further stations in Iceland, Newfoundland, the Azores and Bermuda.

Police officers of the United States and Canada, under the sponsorship of the International Association of Chiefs of Police, begin their Traffic Safety Check on May 15, to curb the rapidly mounting toll of traffic fatalities and injuries. In 1945 28,500 persons lost their lives and 1,000,000 were injured in motor accidents. The police believe these figures can be lowered if all drivers will drive safely in safe cars.

For the convenience of car drivers, a safety lane will be established on Church Street, starting May 15th at 10 A. M., and open till 4 P. M. each day for the ensuing two weeks. ### Prevent Termites Invade Canada

In 1920 and 1931, specimens of subterranean termites were discovered in Ontario but it was not until 1945, when an infestation with damage to structural timbers of houses was reported that comment and speculation were aroused in Canada as to the depredations of these potentially destructive insects. Termites are soft cream-white insects about one-quarter inch long. They shun the light and are seldom seen unless the safety tunnels they construct or the wood that they infest are broken into. Termites nest underground and feed on wood products, and while the infestation in Toronto was by no means severe and there was no immediate danger of an extensive spread, subterranean termites in the United States and other countries are responsible for much damage, including the collapse of buildings.

To give information, and as a means of precaution a publication on "Termites Control in Ontario", by E. B. Watson, Division of Entomology, Dominion Department of Agriculture, Ottawa, and R. W. Thompson, Provincial Entomologist, Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, has been issued by the Division of Entomology. In this publication (Processed Publication No. 36) full information about these insects and methods of control are given. These control measures have been in use in the United States over a period of years and, if properly carried out, termite damage can be stopped or reduced to significant proportions.
