—FURTHER PARTICULARS.—The Winnipeg Free Press says: The body of Pte. J. Jackson, a returned soldier, was found on lot 288 St. Clements, three miles northeast of Bird's Hill, last evening. A bullet wound in his forehead and a 32-calibre Colt revolver grasped in the deceased's right hand, the thumb on the trigger, indicated suicide. Dr. McConnell, provincial coroner, to whom the matter was reported by the police, visited the scene, and the body was brought to Thomson's undertaking rooms. An inquest has been decided upon. A card found upon the deceased, bearing his name and issued by the military convalescent hospital, Deer Lodge, with other papers, supplied the necessary identification. "Returned Invalid, No. 2762." The deceased was neatly dressed. The card referred to was one issued for leave to absent himself from the home until 11 p. m., April 31. The deceased, apparently in good spirits, left Deer Lodge on Sunday shortly after the midday meal and so far as the authorities could learn had not been seen by any of his comrades since that time. It is believed by the authorities that the deceased purchased the revolver and a box of 50 cartridges in the city yesterday. He was found between two straw stacks on the farm worked jointly by Angus McKay and Ernest King. The deceased was about 20 years of age, and was a native of Glasgow, Scotland. He had previously resided for some time at Summerside, P. E. I. So far as could be ascertained by the authorities last night, he has no relatives in this country.

INCORPORATION OF POULTRY ASS'N

The Act incorporating the P. E. Island Egg and Poultry Association provides:

(1) For all the purposes of the Association the members thereof shall be grouped into separate branches to be known as Egg Circles, which shall be designated by number. The individual members in each Circle shall also be designated by number. Egg Circles shall be organized in all districts where it is considered practicable by the Executive of the Association.

(2) The members of the Association shall consist of all persons who have been granted the regular membership certificate of the Association and who are members in good standing of the Local Egg Circle.

(3) The Officers of the Association shall consist of a Board of ten directors to be elected from the delegates of the Egg Circles at an annual meeting. The directors at their first meeting shall appoint a President and three Vice-Presidents, one from each County. A Secretary-Treasurer shall be appointed by the officers.

(4) The officers of an Egg Circle shall consist of at least seven directors to be elected at the annual meeting of the Egg Circle, and the directors at their first meeting shall elect from their number a President, Vice-President, and Secretary-Treasurer.

(5) The Association shall maintain a register in which a record shall be kept of the date of organization of each Egg Circle, together with the name and P. O. Address of each member of the Association, the date on which membership was granted, and the name of the Circle to which membership was granted, and the name of the Circle to which the member belongs.

(6) When an Egg Circle organization is approved of by the Executive of the Association, and registered on the books of the Association it shall have the full power of a separate corporation under the provisions of this Act and under the regulations of the Association.

(7) The Association shall have no share capital but shall create a Fund, to be not less than \$15,000, nor more than \$50,000.

(8) A part of all of this Fund may be invested in such lands, buildings, property, and equipment as may be necessary to carry on the business of the Association.

(9) The Secretary of the Association shall have power, on behalf of the officers, to borrow money from time to time from any bank, upon the credit of the Association in such amounts as they deem proper, and by way of overdraft or otherwise.

(10) The Association shall not declare dividends nor accumulate profits, but such funds as may accumulate from time to time shall be distributed among the total membership according to by-law.

(11) The Association may supplement its funds by means of collateral notes, which shall be furnished by each Egg Circle as required.

(12) Any member of an Egg Circle may resign his membership by giving notice in writing to the Secretary of his Egg Circle. No resignation shall become effective before the end of the then current year.

will directly affecting members of Egg Circles and of the Association. Other provisions have been framed for carrying on the business of the Association and the Circles.

As passed, the bill seems to be workable and calculated to promote the objects in view, viz: (a) The encouragement of the production and marketing of eggs and poultry, and all matters connected therewith.

(b) The supervision of an encouragement in such commercial enterprise as may be deemed advisable by the Association in order to facilitate the more profitable production and disposal of the produce of the individual egg circles.

(c) The encouragement of the purchasing, breeding, and distribution of improved strains of high producing poultry.

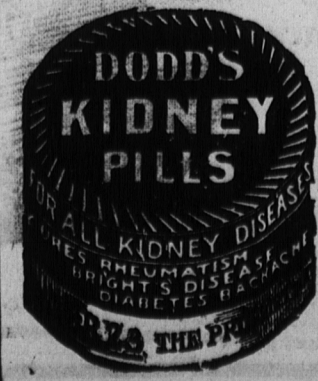
