THE COCKTAIL

The Academic of Medicine, France, has begun a campaign against cocktails owing to their alarming effect, particularly upon women and girls, many of whom are in hospitals suffering from alcoholism. The Paris Academy of Medicine has fully and unanimously approved the conclusions of Dr. Guillaud, who declares that "Cocktails are rank poison, a social menace, and will make idiots of the wisest men. Cocktails may seem to impart eloquence to the dumb, audacity to the timorous, and wit to the feeble minded; in reality they are nothing but illusions. The use of cocktails wished upon us (France) by America is turning the sanest nation on earth into a set of imbeciles."

Who put the cocktail in the homes of the people of Ontario if the Liquor Control Board didn't? What's the matter now? Isn't control controlling?

Another slant on this thing called the "cocktail", is that the world has been told over and over again of late that consumption of light beers and wine tended towards temperance since it discouraged the drinking of hard spirits. Well, what's the matter with France that she now takes to cocktails? The gods know that she has drunk wine enough to cultivate a taste. So experience explodes another wet lie right in their faces.

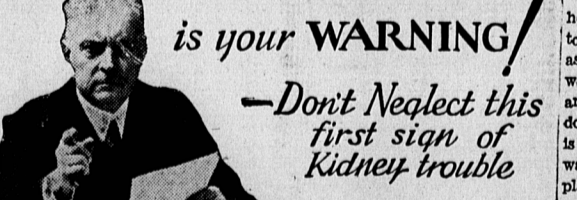

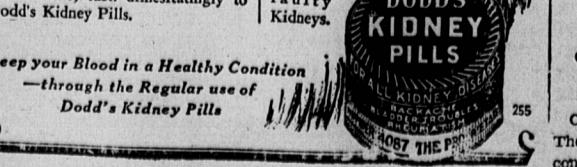
