EASTERN NOTES.—The remarks of the late President of the Board of Trade in your city regarding the advisability of an Island cold-fishing fleet have an interest for the East Point in sight of whose shores every summer the enterprising fishermen of Nova Scotia land their vessels, and whose sons have for many years assisted in manning the vessels of Gloucester which scour the seas from Hatteras to Iceland in quest of fish, and many, many of whom find a sailor's grave in the North Atlantic. That we have the fish is true, perhaps the finest in the world, that our sons have the enterprise required the daring necessary, and the endurance requisite the records of Gloucester for fifty years amply prove, and their achievements on the Grand Banks on George's and shore winter fishing, place where the genuine Yankee is scarce or seldom found, prove that they are willing to do and dare for very moderate remuneration, yet for some reason, with these fisheries and these men we have to admit that vessel fishing was never successful from P. E. Island. Time and again the last fifty years spasmodic efforts have been made to set up a fishing fleet; they all ended the one way, failure; till today I think I may say, there is not a genuine fishing vessel owned on the Island. For the failure there may be different reasons and a difference of opinion as to the reasons.—The marriage question is still a live one. The furious storms and severe weather experienced here as well as elsewhere don't appear to affect it.
