Dear Mother,—It's a long time

arrived at our Camp on Friday on

wish you would send me my little  
pocket testament as I forgot it when  
I left home and we cannot do much  
without one here. Now I will bring  
my letter to a close with lots of love

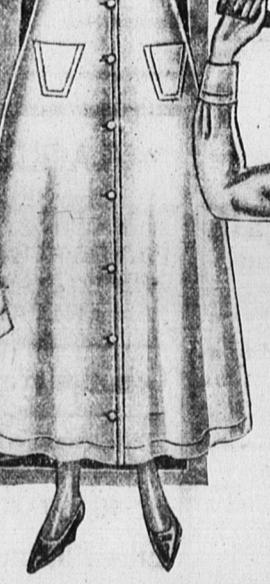
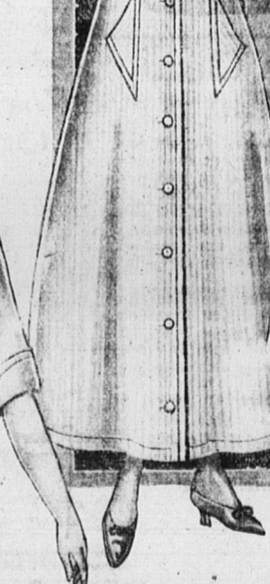

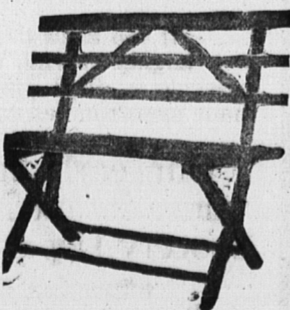
