THE Guardian would impress upon those having set out new orchards, the importance of mulching their young trees at a dry time like this to prevent the rapid escape of moisture from the soil. The method recommended by the Fruit Inspector is to first work up the ground loosely around the tree; then water well, putting a bucket or two of water about each tree, then cover well with a good mulching of straw, sea weed, etc. This method is fully endorsed by J. R. Clark, the veteran tree agent.

A VERY sudden death occurred at Hunter River during the night of Saturday July 2nd in the home of Malcolm Beaton, when his wife was taken from his side without time to say a parting word. She was in the midst of her days and enjoying good health, and scarcely anything could be more unexpected. Mr. Beaton and his family have the deepest sympathy of the entire community. She was buried on Tuesday the 5th inst. in the cemetery at Hunter River. The services were in the Presbyterian Church which was filled to the doors and were conducted by the Rev. G. A. Sellar and the Rev. George Miller.

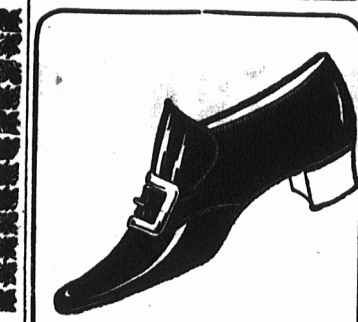
