Identifying The Dead As the black figures were pulled from the water those showing signs of life were taken to an emergency field hospital set up on the dock in the centre of a circle of ambulances. Pockets were searched, union cards in most cases brought quick identifications. Personal belongings were put in an envelope tied on one wrist. To the other wrist was attached a baggage tag listing name, address and union connections. The bodies were put in pine boxes, side by side, box on box.
