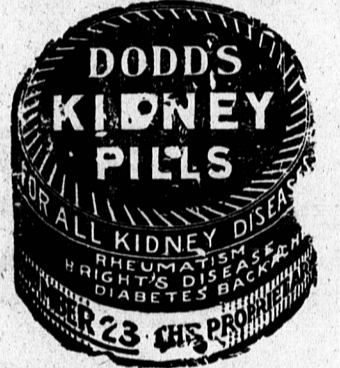

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section on each side his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$500. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of drought, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W. PRIVATE BENJAMIN F. SENCABAUGH

The home of Mr. and Mrs. B.H. Sencabaugh, Murray Harbor was made sad a few days ago by the news of the death of their son Pte. Benj. F. Sencabaugh, in France on Sept. 24th. The deceased was the youngest son. He left his home in July 1910 for the United States. Early last spring he signed on in the American Expeditionary Forces and in due time crossed over to France. He had not been there long when he was taken down with pneumonia from which he was unable to recover. He was twenty-nine years of age. Cooper R. Drewry, Capt. Q. M. C. U. S. A., in conveying the sad news of his death to his parents says "Private Sencabaugh, was an excellent soldier, who was universally liked by his officers and his fellow-soldiers, and his unfortunate death is a source of general sorrow to all of us." "His death was in the line of duty and not the result of his own misconduct." This promising young life is cut off in the pursuit of a noble enterprise and a holy cause and this feeling will keep the grief-stricken parents, sisters and brothers to bear their great sorrow. Besides his parents the deceased leaves to mourn their loss five sisters: Mrs. H. Atherton, Mrs. B.M. Woodward, Miss Nellie and Miss Laura in Province R. I. (the latter being home now on a visit), Mrs. Geo. McLeod in Medford, Mass., also four brothers,—Albert in N.S., Harold in Winchester, Mass., Wm. in Medford, Mass., and Henry in Murray Harbor, P. E. I.
