Inquest Ordered Into Death Of Souris Woman

The body of Mrs. John McIsaac, 65, formerly Annie Smith of Souris, was found on the east side of Rocky Point Shore yesterday morning. Mrs. McIsaac, wife of Mr. John McIsaac, who operates a lumber mill at Souris East, had been visiting her aunt, Mrs. W.O. Davey, 30 Weymouth St., City, for the past two weeks while receiving medical care. She went for a walk Thursday afternoon about one o'clock, and when she did not return that evening it was presumed she had gone to Souris. On checking with her home in Souris yesterday morning, however, it was found that she was not there, and upon further investigation it was learned that she was seen Thursday afternoon on the Rocky Point ferry. A search was immediately carried out by the R.C.M.P. in that vicinity, which resulted in the finding of her body on the shore.

Child's Death Found Accidental

A verdict of accidental death was returned by a coroner's jury last night empaneled to inquire into the death of five and one-half year old Claudia Jane Warren which occurred around 8 p.m. Monday evening directly in front of her home on Great George Street.

The coroner was Dr. J.D. McGuigan, with John P. Nicholson representing the Crown.

CAUSE OF DEATH was a fracture at the base of the skull caused by coming in contact with some blunt instrument, Dr. J. Harold Shaw, provincial pathologist, testified after he had performed a partial autopsy on the body.

Coroner's Inquest Held at Montague

At an inquest held at Montague yesterday a coroner's jury found James Leigh Stewart had died from natural causes, presumably a heart attack, on Sunday, April 2, at Mitchell River. Coroner J. S. Inman presided.

The jury based its verdict upon the findings of Dr. Harold Shaw, provincial pathologist. Dr. Shaw's report showed that the stomach of the deceased contained 16 milligrams of alcohol per C.C. at the time of death.

Mrs. Nellie Stewart, mother of deceased, said James was feeling well when he left Charlottetown to go to the river. He had been sick in Halifax before he came home. He was out of work and discouraged.

Mrs. Ceil Drake said Mary Fraser and the deceased were both in her store on the afternoon of April 2. Mr. Drake asked both to go to the river. He had a few minutes saying Stewart had fallen on the road and was apparently dead.
