Suspected Indian

Slayer Arrested

(By The Canadian Press) LONDON, Ont., May 13 - Suspected slayer of his 20-year-old Indian bride of two weeks, Leale Hill gave himself up late today at the hamlet of Promé, 15 miles south of here and handed over his hunting rifle to the police who said he would be charged with murder.

Just five hours earlier, his pretty wife, the former Kathleen Keefe, was found lying fatally wounded inside the door of the home of her step-father, Amos de Leary, with whom the young couple had been living since their marriage. Mr. de Leary said the 21-year-old Indian and his wife became involved in an argument outside the house.

Hill wanted her to go to Brantford, but she refused until he had a job there. "Hill went around to the back of the house and called his wife," said Mr. de Leary. "The next thing we heard was a scream." "The girl's mother ran around to the back of the house and the daughter (Mrs. Hill) went around to the other side of the door. The girl collapsed just inside the door," Mr. de Leary said he went up to the girl and asked: "Was it a wasp?" He said she replied: "He stabbed me" and lapsed into unconsciousness.

THE JOB: There are openings in many of the ground trades, including aero-engine and air-frame mechanics, armourers, telephonic and photographic workers, clerks and cooks. In some trades training will be provided. All offer advancement in return for hard work and proficiency. Applicants without previous service must be over 18 and under 26. THE PAY: Basic pay plus living allowances for non-commissioned ranks runs from \$95 monthly for Aircraftman Class 2 to \$188 for Warrant Officer Class One; extra pay for trade proficiency and increased pay after three years in any rank; marriage allowance of \$20 a month; free uniform clothing and medical and dental service.
