**A NEW DEPARTURE**—Arrangements have been made for starting classes of Physical culture for girls and young women at the Y. M. C. A. immediately after the holidays. At the regular monthly meeting of the Ladies Auxiliary held a day or two ago it was decided to take hold of this feature of work for the girls of this city. The Auxiliary has engaged Miss Maud McLean as instructor and she will begin her work the first of the new year. There will be classes for any group which can get twenty or more to enrol. All ready classes from Prince street school and P. W. C. have signified their intention to enter. No doubt others will follow. Miss McLean is a graduate of Emerson College Boston and has had three years training in Physical work. The course she will use will be especially adapted to girls and women. She will introduce many attractive games into the class work. As the work grows it is hoped to take up other things as conducted under the Camp fire girls organization. The need is also felt for a reading room and meeting place for the girls and women and it is hoped that under the leadership of Miss McLean it will not be long before such a place can be secured. The work of the Camp Fire Girls as it is being conducted in Amherst will be studied by Miss McLean, and she left for Amherst yesterday morning to take up a study of the same.
