PROHIBITION BY PROVINCES.

As is well known the two Provinces of Manitoba and Prince Edward Island have enacted prohibitory liquor laws, and the question of the constitutionality of the Manitoba law, having been argued before the Judicial Committee now awaits the judgment of that high tribunal.

The Montreal Herald, the leading English Liberal organ in Quebec Province, is by no means favorable to prohibition, but it says:

"For some reason there is a belief in very well informed circles in Ontario that the coming judgment of the Privy Council will favor the contention that Manitoba is within her right in passing prohibitory legislation for the Province. Of course the ruling may go just the other way, but something of the confidence with which the temperance advocates await the issue may be gleaned from the fact that they have already elicited from Hon. Mr. Ross a confirmation of the pledge, given years ago by Sir Oliver Mowat, that he would bring down prohibitory legislation whenever it was established that the Provincial Legislatures had the right to pass it."

From this we learn not only that the prevalent opinion is that provincial prohibition is within the competence of the Provincial Legislatures, but also that if the Manitoba law is sustained by the Judicial Committee it will be followed by like legislation in the great Province of Ontario. It is almost equally certain that in such case the Provinces of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick will pass prohibitory laws. The result of successive plebiscites in those Provinces goes to show that large majorities of their people are in favor of the abolition of the common traffic in liquor.

Be it observed these this sweeping results are likely to follow when once it is authoritatively decided that the Provinces have the right to prohibit. Any mere technical defect that may now be found in the Manitoba law, or that may later be found in the Island prohibitory law, such defect being capable of being cured by amendment, will not prevent the result to which we have adverted.

We have strong hopes that the judgment of the Judicial Committee will be forthcoming before the close of the current year, and it may be within a few weeks or even a few days to come. In any case it may be hoped for in time to be acted upon by the Legislatures of the English-speaking Provinces at their next sessions. If so there are stirring times ahead in the

matter of temperance legislation affecting large and important sections of the Dominion.

It is therefore important that the temperance organizations in all the Provinces shall be on the alert and ready for action. They should be ready to insist upon the energetic enforcement of the laws we have, in Manitoba and P. E. Island, and ready in Ontario, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick to insist upon the Legislatures doing their duty.

Let the temperance sentiment be rallied all along the line from Sydney to Vancouver. This is necessary alike to secure the enactment of good laws and to secure their enforcement and observance. It is equally necessary to the moral health of the community. It will not do to rely merely upon law to the exclusion of educative work and moral suasion. Both must go on together.
