THE CANADIAN HIGH COMMISSIONER'S OFFICE IN LONDON WEEK BY WEEK. During the week 200 visitors came to the office of which 52 registered and 139 had interviews. The High Commissioner's Office is now recognised by the public over here as a source of information on every subject relating to trade and industry and the economic development of our Dominion. The office is thoroughly equipped with reports of every department of the Dominion, and of the Provincial Governments in order to meet the demands made by people in Great Britain contemplating trade with, or investment in, Canada.

In addition, an endeavour is made to secure the publication in Trade Journals and technical publications read by business men) of information received by the Office relating to Hydro-Electrical development, trade expansion, etc. This branch of the Canadian Office work will probably increase in importance, if, as one of the expected results of the Imperial Economic Conference there should be a greater desire among business men in both countries to get together with the development of the Empire.

The High Commissioner and the Right Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King attended the lunch given by the Directors of the British Empire Exhibition at Wembley and were much pleased with the progress of the Canadian Exhibition Buildings. The speech of the day was that of the Rt. Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King.

A proposal has been made by the Imperial War Graves Commission to take over the care of older naval and military cemeteries like those at Sentari and Tel-el-Kebir. The Dominion Premiers now in London are to be asked if they concur.

The High Commissioner has consented to become a vice President of the Public Works, Roads and Transport Congress and Exhibition to be held in London, November 22-29. Mr. W. W. Campbell (Good Roads Campbell) Chief Commissioner of the Congress in the Canadian Department of Railways and Canals, has been appointed to represent the Dominion at the Congress.

Flora Shaw of "The Times") has asked the High Commissioner for his help in the matter of interest in the Canadian and other agricultural experts, over here for the Imperial Conferences, in the breed of her fine herd of Berkshire pigs at her place near Dorking, in Surrey. A suggestion has been received by the Canadian Office that prizes should be offered for Canadian Cattle at the Scottish National Fat Stock Show, at Edinburgh, and also at the Smithfield National Show both to be held in December. Specimen copies of Canadian periodicals devoted to Agricultural and livestock interests have been freely supplied to people anxious to trade with the Dominion. In addition to the files of newspapers and periodicals always accessible in the Reading Room of the Canadian Office, back numbers are willingly supplied to people who ask for them. Captain H. R. Pickup's work in organizing the repatriation of Canadian ex-soldiers and their dependents is now drawing to a close. The bulk of the work was wound up on the 30th September and the repatriation of Canadian born men and women and their families will be undertaken by the Canadian High Commissioner's Office. A great number of applications are still being received, but only about 5 p. c. of these are Canadian born. Steps are being taken to deal with the remainder under the nominated passage scheme. The 6 p. c. monthly interest on the Rumanian loan, amounting to \$480,000 (four hundred and eighty thousand dollars) was paid through the Canadian Office last week.
