CANADIAN CELEBRITIES.

The current number of The Canadian Magazine has for the subject of this month's "Canadian Celebrities" series, Rev. Dr. Burke, of Alberton. The writer in the two pages devoted to his topic has, very fairly we think, made known the qualities which have marked Father Burke in his relations with the people of his native Province, and has not understated the fact when he says: "As a publicist, Father Burke is not only esteemed by Prince Edward Island, but by the Federal authorities as well. "By the out of the job" returned the Duke, calmly, "I should say it was myself."

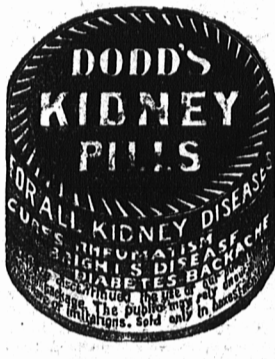

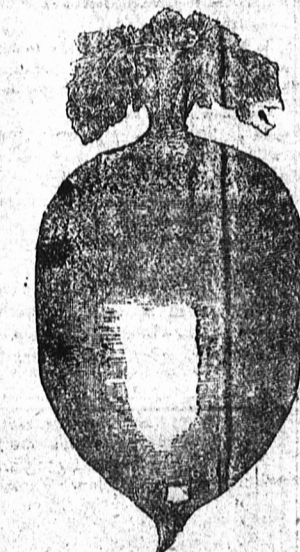
