BRITAIN'S PROTEST AGAINST CANAL BILL.

Britain's protest against the United States' proposal to make the Panama Canal free to American shipping while imposing tolls upon British vessels has raised a little flurry in certain quarters, especially among the jingoists of the United States. The more thoughtful newspapers however are taking a saner view of the matter.

The New York Evening Post points out that Americans may be disposed to say that any regulations Congress may make regarding the canal can be no concern of Great Britain's, as Americans should be able to do what they will with their own. It points out also that a weighty question of state is involved. It says:

"Our national good faith in living up to the obligations of a treaty is called in question. It will never do to say that the Panama Canal is our own property and that we can do what we like with it. It is ours, indeed, but it is impressed with a lien, in the shape of a solemn national pledge, which we gave at the time of acquiring the right to exclusive control of its operation. In the way of that, the Clayton-Bulwer treaty stood as an obstacle. Specifically to remove any objection which may arise out of that treaty to the construction of such a canal under the auspices of the government of the United States the Hay-Pauncefote treaty was negotiated in 1901, ratified and proclaimed in 1902. It is now printed by our government in the volume of treaties in force."

The obligations of that national pledge were further acknowledged in the United States' treaty with the newly created Republic of Panama. One article in this treaty provides that the canal shall be opened, and operated "in conformity with all the stipulations of the treaty with Great Britain."

...darity, their oneness of aim and purpose, and their cohesion of interests.

NOTES.

In an editorial under the caption, The Prohibition Act, yesterday, the Orange celebration at Kelvin was included, among other recent gatherings, as the scene of rowdiness and drunkenness. The statement, which was made on what we regarded as good authority, it appears was not correct. Rev. D. McLean, who is officially associated with the Order and who was present on this occasion, informs us that there was no fighting and very little drunkenness. We gladly make this correction.

Mr. McLean informs us also, however, that a party from Summerside, whose name is known, arrived on the scene with a double carriage well supplied with whisky, which it was the intention to sell on or near the grounds, and the sale of which had actually begun. The managing committee, on being informed of this promptly ordered the illicit vendor off and he left, reluctantly, his game being blocked at the outset.

It will be noted that this in no way affects the statement we made with reference to the enforcement of the Prohibition Act. The fact that but little liquor was sold was due, not to any efforts that are being made to enforce the law, but to the prompt action of the managing committee. The liquor was available; it was brought to be sold; it was discovered, not by watchful officers of the law but by the managing committee, aided possibly by too much confidence, on the part of the vendor, in the looseness of the law. Had the committee been less watchful, had the vendor been more astute, the sale would have been proceeded with. All that we said about the enforcement of the Act stands.


