Hitler's Purge Extends To Fighting Fronts

AT THE FRENCH FRONTIER, July 23 - (AP) - Reliable reports tonight said Adolf Hitler's purge has extended to the fighting fronts in Russia and France and at least eight eastern front commanders have been arrested or ousted.

A number of divisional officers in France have been arrested or are in hiding.

Minor fights have occurred at Bordeaux, Limoges, Niamey and Mantua in France between the Elise SS and army men.

While there has not been a report of any fighting in the West, it is known from a report from France that widespread reports of the arrest of Gen. Johannes Blaskowitz of the German army are being made.
