ANOTHER VOICE IN FAVOR OF RECIPROCITY.

The Eastern Chronicle of New Glasgow, N. S., is a staunch Liberal newspaper, with views of its own upon many questions. It favors reciprocity although printed in the coal region. Its editor scolds the idea that it should be thought either disloyal or unwise to endeavor to get a fair trade arrangement with our next neighbors, of whom we are now buying twice as much as we sell to them. Moreover The Chronicle finds that something must be done for Nova Scotia to save it from becoming depopulated. It goes on: "In 1879 the National Policy was inaugurated and has been with a few alterations in force ever since. In 1909, thirty years afterwards, the majority of the counties in Nova Scotia had decreased in population, not only losing the natural increase of population, but a good many others in addition. To us that is a deplorable record and a man that loved his country and would rejoice to see it prosper would feel like doing what he could to see its people provided with avenues of trade that would cause them to stay at home and develop its resources."

According to The Chronicle, Pictou County has lost 10,000 of its native born population since 1879. "We were told thirty years ago," it says, "and innumerable times since that the N. P. would make Pictou County

rich and prosperous; but, has it? No country can be prosperous which has such a drain on its chief and best products,—men and women. Apparently, Westville, Stellarton and New Glasgow have fared better than other parts of the county, but when the apparent prosperity of these three places has not kept up the normal population of the county, something must be 'rotten in the state of Denmark.' For our part we have not the slightest doubt that, as a whole, Nova Scotia would be benefited by a reciprocity treaty with the United States—so would all Canada."

This is a voice from the coal country, and it is the more significant at a time when the coal operators have declared against reciprocity. What is to save to Nova Scotia its farming population? "Day by day our people are leaving home for the United States," says The Chronicle, and to show that its views are shared by many in both political parties it quotes from "one of the most pronounced Conservatives in the county" this statement: "The Province is being bled white for the sake of coal and steel and I am getting tired of it."

Evidently there are a good many in the sister Province who think that reciprocity would be a boon to Nova Scotia, as it undoubtedly would be to Prince Edward Island.

"We submit that there's not much 'logical' difference between 17 1/2 per cent. duty on harvesters and 15 per cent. and that the concession of 2 1/2 per cent. to popular opinion would not be illogical from the protectionist point of view."—The Examiner.

The Guardian is not disposed to quibble about words and phrases in this matter. We have contended all along that the Canadian duty on farm implements is too high, much higher than is necessary to afford the manufacturers any needed protection, so high as to be a burden upon the farming industry, and that this duty ought to be forthwith reduced at least to a level with the duty in the United States.

CRIME REDUCED FIFTY PER CENT.

North Carolina is now under a prohibitory liquor law, and with very excellent results, if the State's Chief Justice can be admitted as an authority. In the opinion of Chief Justice Walter Clark of the Supreme Court of that State, the new State-wide prohibition law has reduced general crime 50 per cent. Others consider the figures conservative. The returns for last year and this year, which have just been made up, prove the statement of the Chief Justice.

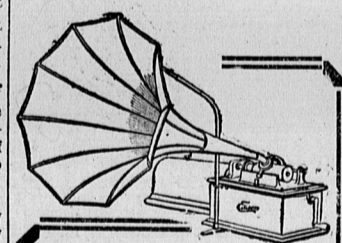
Murder in first degree showed a decline of 32 per cent. in the two years, burglary 20 per cent., attacks with deadly weapons 30 per cent., larceny 40 per cent., manslaughter 35 per cent., murder in second degree 21 per cent., minor crimes from 25 to 55 per cent. There has been a falling off of 15 per cent. in violations of the anti-liquor laws.

It was not always thus in North Carolina, if we may credit the historic remark of its Governor to the Governor of South Carolina. But most all countries have had their bibulous days. Here in the far north we know the benefits of a prohibitory law which enables the Province to keep its criminal record far below that of any other section of the Dominion. It is gratifying to learn that prohibition is also making good in the south. Surely it is worth while and is good paying business in any country to reduce crime by 50 per cent.

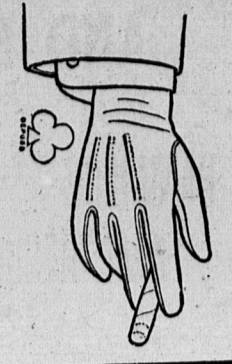

The rich green of the fields on November 30 made our own an Emerald Isle, even on St. Andrew's Day.

It is stated on apparently good authority that there are now over 500 aviators in the world who from time to time are soaring in the air. In France alone 270 licenses have been issued to persons desiring to go aloft, a license for the purpose being there required. So far the deaths from accident have been about 6 per cent. The total distance flown so far is estimated at 125,000 miles, or six times round the world at the equator. There has been one death for each 4,166 miles travelled in the air, or 39 in all.

The split in the Unionist party in the United Kingdom over tariff reform must tend to the advantage of the Government party. It is now practically admitted that tariff reform cannot be a leading issue in the campaign. Still there are many who think the political situation may not be greatly changed by the result of the pending election and that the constitutional question as between the Lords and the Commons may have to be again submitted to a conference of the party leaders after the polling is over.

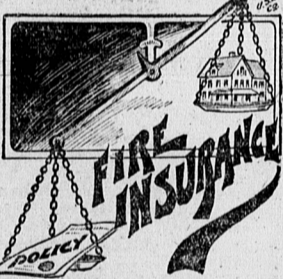
