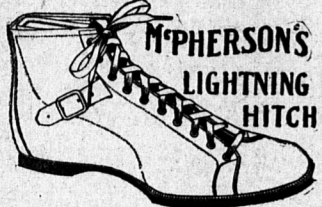

The Judge of Probate Wednesday heard rather an unusual application arising in the estate of the late Felix Feehan of Lot 65, who died there on the 4th of December last. It appears that on the 7th of December an application was made to the Surrogate by Patrick Feehan, a brother of the deceased representing that he had died intestate and asking for Letters of Administration to the Estate. The application was granted, and Administration given to Patrick. Subsequently Mrs. Mary Ellen Walsh, a sister of the deceased, presented a will and codicil made in the month of November last and asked the Court to admit them to Probate and issue an administration grant to her—she being the devise named in the will. The Judge of Probate thereupon cited the Administrator Patrick Feehan to appear Wednesday and produce and deliver up the Letters of Administration and show cause why they should not be cancelled and declared void and his appointment as Administrator revoked. The brother Patrick Feehan appeared at the return of the citation and objected to the revocation on the ground that the will and codicil produced did not deal with the Testator's personal estate, but only with his real estate and that therefore the grant to him should stand. At the conclusion of the argument the Judge cancelled the Letters of Administration issued to Patrick Feehan and allowed the will and codicil to be admitted to Probate and appointed Mrs. Walsh Administratrix with will annexed. The will and codicil deals only with the Testator's real estate which he gave to his sister Mrs. Walsh, and does not appoint any Executor. J. J. Johnston appeared as Proctor for Mrs. Walsh, and Alder Brehaut for the Administrator Patrick Feehan.
