LONDON, Aug. 5—A special despatch to the Exchange Telegraph Company from Geneva says:—The Sultan of Turkey was stabbed in the breast on Monday night by a minor palace official. The coat of mail which the Sultan always wears deflected the blow. The would-be assassin was arrested. Apparently he had been bribed to commit the act as he had a large sum of gold in his pockets and his baggage was packed ready for flight. The news was received in Geneva yesterday in a telegram from Constantinople to a young Turk here.
