Cemetery by about fifty members of the C. M. B. A. branches of Summerside, of which deceased was a member, Miscouche and Kensington who marched in a body. In the procession also were several hundred scholars of the public schools, the late Dr. having been a member of the Board of School Trustees for many years. The remains were taken into St. Paul's church where Requiem High Mass was celebrated, by Rev. A. P. McLellan, brother of deceased and Rev. J. A. McDonald, Master of Ceremonies. Seated in the Sanctuary were His Lordship Bishop McDonald, Rev. Dr. Curran, Rector of St. Dunstan's, Rev. P. P. Arsenault of Mount Carmel and Rev. J. C. McLean. The Gregorian Requiem was chanted by the St. Paul's choir. At the Offertory W. J. Whitney sang the De Profundis as a solo, the choir joining in the chorus. Immediately after Mass the office for the dead was sung by His Lordship the Bishop. Following this Miss Wickham sang very pathetically Nearer My God to Thee. The services at the grave were conducted by Rev. J. C. McLean assisted by the male portion of the St. Paul's choir under the direction of Mr. Whitney. The pall bearers were James A. McNeill, D. B. McDonald, Capt. D. McKinnon, Charles Murphy, C. Kane, Frank Perry.
