LARGE NUMBER OF DIVORCE CASES.

OTTAWA, Feb. 11.—The number of divorce applications before the Senate this year is the largest on record, namely, twenty-four. Since Confederation the total number of divorces granted by Parliament has been sixty four.

ENGLISH MAGAZINES INCREASE IN NUMBERS.

LONDON, Feb. 11.—Postmaster General Buxton, in addressing the Dudley Chamber of Commerce, referred to the change of postal rate on magazines between Britain and Canada, and said it benefited the publishers of English magazines to a very great extent. At the present time there are in circulation no less than 6,000,000 copies of such magazines, which were previously excluded on account of the heavy postal charges.

POLITICAL SIGNIFICANCE OF HIS MAJESTY'S VISIT TO THE KAISER.

BERLIN, Feb. 11.—Great weight was lent to the political significance of King Edward's visit in consequence of the long private conference which Sir Charles Harding had with Von Buelow. The subjects under discussion then were made public, but the fact that the British Under Secretary was clasped with the Imperial Chancellor is regarded as highly important. It indicates that the royal sojourn is not a mere visit of courtesy, but intended to influence future political developments between Great Britain and Germany.

ICE PALACE OPENING'S LARGE ATTENDANCE.

MONTREAL, Feb. 11.—The Winter Carnival opened in the midst of a severe snow-storm, but this was no disadvantage, as there were no opening formalities. The ice palace is finished, except the lighting, and was visited by enormous crowds during the afternoon and evening.

COMMANDER SPAIN IS LIKELY TO BE SUCCEEDED BY ADMIRAL KINGSMILL.

OTTAWA, Feb. 11.—In consequence of the report of Justice Cassels on the Marine Department, Commander Spain, Dominion Wreck Commissioner, and Mr. Fraser, Commissioner of Lights, will leave the Government Service. Their resignations are now in the hands of Hon. Mr. Brodeur. Spain will complete his reports with regard to several recent wreck investigations before he finally steps out.

Fraser has been under suspension nearly a year, and his retirement was a foregone conclusion. Further action will be taken by the Minister in the near future with respect to other officials implicated during the investigation.

Admiral Kingsmill will probably succeed Spain as Wreck Commissioner, while at the same time retaining his present position. The whole of the session was occupied by a discussion on French-Canadian repatriation and colonization from the New England States.

NEXT JUDGE OF SUPREME COURT.

OTTAWA, Feb. 11.—The names of Mr. Justice Osler, of the Ontario Appeal Court, and of Hon. Mr. Sutherland, ex-Speaker of the House of Commons, are mentioned as the probable successors to the vacancy on the Supreme Court Bench, created by the retirement of Mr. Justice McLennan.

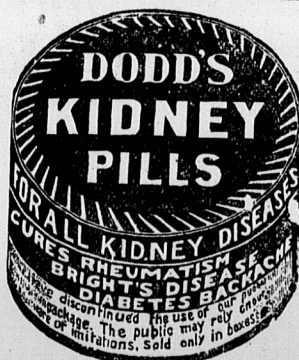

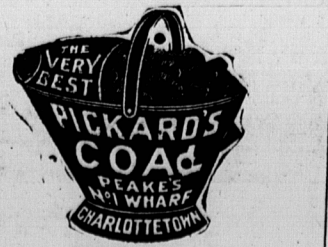
