Parisian Editor Gets Twenty Years

PARIS, Oct. 31. - (CP) - Stephane Lauzanne, 70-year-old editor of the Paris newspaper Le Matin, was convicted today on Collusion with the enemy and sentenced to 20 years solitary confinement as the Paris purge trials entered their second week.

The French journalist escaped the death penalty after the jury found him guilty under extenuating circumstances. For the first time in French History the jury included two women.

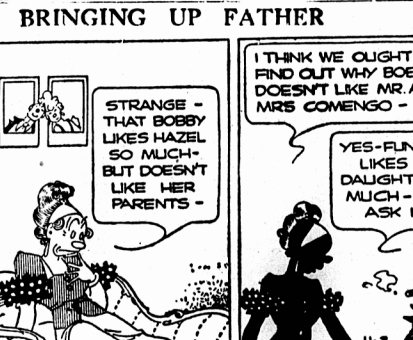
Lauzanne told the court that his title editor-in-chief had been only honorary since 1920 and that most of the articles bearing his name had been written under orders of the newspaper's owner, Emmanuel Billaud-Latour, described as extremely pro-Nazi.

Debate New Tax Act In Sask.

REGINA, Nov. 1 - (CP) - Resources Minister J.L. Phelps charged in the Saskatchewan Legislature today that members of the Liberal opposition had shown they "had nulled their banner" to the coalitional big interests, during debate on the taxation of minerals act.

The act, authorizing the Resources Department to tax mineral rights not owned by the crown at five cents an acre in 1945 and thereafter.
