CALL FOR VOLUNTEERS.

Our despatches tell of severe fighting in South Africa, of the Canadian Government's decision to send a thousand men to reinforce the Imperial armies, and the orders wired yesterday to Lieut.-Col. Moore to enlist men within his military district:

This is the first time a call has come to Prince Edward Island for men to assist in the military service of the Empire beyond the sea. "Hundreds upon hundreds" are volunteering in the western Provinces. We trust that our loyal Islanders will prove equally patriotic and prompt in their response to the call.

The Asylum Commission, it is understood, presented a short preliminary report to the Lieutenant Governor on Saturday. The object of this prompt and brief report is to direct the attention of the Government at once to the question of proper heating during the coming winter. It is understood that the report asks for an immediate inspection of the building with a view to place the heating apparatus in the best possible condition. If the present system of heating cannot be made effective then they ask that the Government will immediately replace it with a system that will give an even temperature night and day, and that the fires shall be kept up through the night during the cold weather.

BATTLESHIP LAUNCHED

Yacht Race Postponed — A Sound Steamer Burned And 8 Lives Lost.

NEW YORK, Oct. 14.—[Special].—A dead calm rendered necessary the seventh postponement of the yacht race today.
